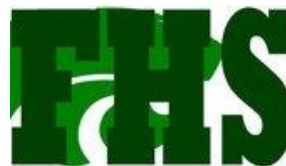

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

If you spend much time in the company of the Jesuits who lived in Latin America in the eighties and nineties, it won't be long before you hear the name Mev Puleo. I've noticed that she is the dearest friend, the most beloved companion of the Jesuits who were alive and living in Central and South America during those wrenching years of war and struggle.

She was, by all accounts, a radiantly joyful young American woman whose life changed on a bus ride, much like that world-changing train ride St. Teresa of Calcutta took in 1946. Both women looked out a window---Mev as a teenager on a family trip to Brazil in 1977, Mother Teresa traveling from Calcutta to Darjeeling ---and observed the staggering distance between the world of the privileged and those who never had a chance.

Mev lived and worked as a photojournalist in El Salvador, Haiti and Brazil. She documented, from the eloquent silence of her camera, the daily courage and kindness of those who are poor, and the malevolent oppression of those who prey upon them.

She spoke in the light what she witnessed in the dark. She even, of all terrifying things, once witnessed a rape in progress. She drove her old Volkswagen up to the sidewalk and shone her headlights right onto the scene. The rapist hollered for her to leave, and when she held fast, he left instead.

Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed. She used her camera to announce far and wide the atrocities suffered by the "least" at the hands of the "greatest." If this gospel passage (Matthew 10:26-33) brings to mind some time when you held your tongue when someone told a racist joke, take it as a nudge from the Holy Spirit to be more courageous next time.

How will you proclaim from the housetops what God has whispered in your heart?

Decimosegundo Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Si pasas algo de tiempo en compañía de los Jesuitas que vivieron en Latinoamérica en los años ochentas y noventas, no tendrás que esperar mucho para que te mencionen el nombre Mev Puelo. Me he dado cuenta de que ella fue la amiga más querida, la más amada compañera de los Jesuitas que vivieron en Centro y Sudamérica durante esos terribles años de lucha y guerra.

Ella era, en toda la expresión de la palabra, una radiante y alegre chica americana que tuvo un cambio de vida en un viaje de autobús, muy parecido a aquel viaje que cambiaría el mundo, el que tomó Santa Teresa de Calcuta en 1946. Ambas mujeres iban viendo por la ventana—Mev era una adolescente en un viaje familiar a Brasil en 1977, la Madre Teresa viajaba de Calcuta a Darjeeling—y observaba la distancia abismal entre el mundo de los privilegiados y el de aquellos a los que se les negaron todas las oportunidades.

Mev vivió y trabajó como fotógrafa periodista en el Salvador, Haití y Brasil. Documentó desde silencio elocuente de su cámara, el valor y la bondad cotidiana de aquellos que son pobres, y la malévol opresión de aquellos que los victimizan.

Habló en la luz acerca de lo que presenció en la oscuridad. Inclusive una vez, entre tantas otras cosas aterradoras, presenció una violación mientras sucedía. Condujo su Volkswagen hasta la acera y aluzó la escena. El violador le gritó que se fuera, y cuando ella persistió en quedarse, él se marchó rápidamente.

No hay nada escondido que no llegue a saberse. Utilizó su cámara para anunciar por todos lados las atrocidades que sufren los “insignificantes” a manos de los “poderosos.” Si este pasaje del evangelio (Mateo 10:26-33) te recuerda algún momento en que te mordiste la lengua cuando alguien hizo un chiste racista, acepta la corrección del Espíritu Santo para que seas más valiente la próxima vez.

¿Cómo gritarás desde las azoteas lo que Dios te ha susurrado en el corazón?
