I really like our Next Door Digest, a neighborly check-in that alerts adjacent zip codes about lost pets, stolen catalytic converters, and the most HEAVENLY peach pie recipes.

The thing I like best are the comments. Unlike the vicious comments attached to so many online stories, our neighbors always have something uplifting and gracious to add: *So glad you found your dog! This kindergarten sounds perfect for our child---thanks for posting!*

I am so used to being around people who are “kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving,” that the “fury, anger, shouting, and reviling” that goes on in just about every publication still shocks me.

Most shocking of all is that this vitriol exists in Catholic online stories. This is such a terrible witness to Christ that I’m shocked all over again that, after being subjected to it, that there is a single believer standing. One wonders what the Church Father Tertullian would think, since he so famously wrote, “these Christians, see how they love one another.”

From whence does this ugly rhetoric spring? I have my own suspects, but certainly the rudeness and mean-spiritedness of those who take the time to respond to stories about their fellow citizens, or just about any story about the Church, reflects the increasing coarseness of our society.

But maybe it’s not “increasing” at all. (Tertullian himself was no shrinking violet when it came to speaking his mind.) Every age has its violence. But we who believe should be a beacon of light, a warm sauna of love and kindness, like that angel who brought food and drink to Elijah in the desert. That’s a living, radical faith.

How are you living a counter-cultural, radical faith?

Realmente me gusta nuestro Next Door Digest, un registro de vecinos que alerta a los códigos postales adyacentes sobre mascotas perdidas, convertidores catalíticos robados y las recetas de pastel de durazno más CELESTIALES.

Lo que más me gusta son los comentarios. A diferencia de los comentarios viciosos adjuntos a tantas historias en línea, nuestros vecinos siempre tienen algo edificante y amable que agregar: *¡Me alegro de que hayas encontrado a tu perro! Este jardín de infantes suena perfecto para nuestro hijo --- ¡gracias por publicar!*

Estoy tan acostumbrado a estar rodeado de personas que son “amables entre sí, compasivas, indulgentes”, que la “furia, la ira, los gritos y las injurias” que ocurren en casi todas las publicaciones todavía me sorprenden.

Lo más impactante de todo es que este vitriolo existe en las historias católicas en línea. Es un terrible testimonio por Cristo y siempre me sorprende de que, después de ver eso, quede un solo creyente de pie. Uno se pregunta qué pensaría el Padre Tertuliano de la Iglesia, ya que él escribió tan famoso, “estos cristianos, vean cómo se aman unos a otros”.

¿De dónde surge esta fea retórica? Tengo mis propios sospechosos, pero ciertamente la rudeza y mezquindad de quienes se toman el tiempo para escribir comentarios en las historias sobre políticos, quienes nuestros conciudadanos o casi cualquier historia sobre la Iglesia, refleja la creciente tosquedad de nuestra sociedad.

Pero tal vez esto realmente no esté “aumentando”. (El propio Tertuliano no tenía pelos en la lengua cuando se trataba de decir lo que pensaba). Cada época tiene su violencia. Pero los que creemos debemos ser un faro de luz, una cálida sauna de amor y bondad, como ese ángel que trajo comida y bebida a Elías en el desierto. Esa es una fe viva y radical.
