Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Oh, James. Oh, John. You were the eyewitnesses. You were called by Jesus himself, straight off your father's boat. You were with him from the beginning of his public life. You witnessed heart-stopping things, like crippling unclean spirits expelled, and blind eyes opened, and a paralyzed man dropped down the roof so that Jesus could heal him; body and soul.

You alone, with Peter, were part of the privileged triad Jesus allowed to witness the raising of Jairus' daughter (Mk 5:37), and the blinding light of the Transfiguration (Mk 9:2-13). How is it that, after your nearness to him, you didn't grasp that to drink the cup that he would drink meant you would join him in suffering?

Remember when Peter tried to remove Jesus from that suffering, assuring him that he would never die a violent death? Jesus was looking RIGHT AT YOU when he said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan" (Mk 8:33)!

That's okay. We would have thought the same thing. After all, look at all the miracles! But surely you realized, that terrible night in Gethsemane, when you were once again singled out, with Peter, to stay awake and pray with him (Mk 14: 32-36), that when he prayed the cup be taken away from him, that cup must be terrible? And did you remember, then, how you had once begged for that cup?

We don't know how you died, John. Tradition believes you lived a long life and died in Ephesus. But you, James, were stoned by order of Herod Agrippa I. According to Spanish tradition, your body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, where your shrine attracts Christian pilgrims from all over the world. And the cup of suffering continues for martyrs even today.

What cup of suffering do you accept every day?

Vigésimo Noveno Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Oh, Santiago. Oh, Juan. Ustedes fueron los testigos presenciales. Jesús mismo los llamó, directamente del barco de su padre. Estuvieron con él desde el comienzo de su vida pública. Fueron testigos de cosas que paralizaron su corazón, como la expulsión de espíritus inmundos y paralizantes, la apertura de ojos ciegos y un hombre paralítico que se dejó caer por el techo para que Jesús pudiera sanarlo, en cuerpo y alma.

Solo ustedes, con Pedro, fueron parte del trio privilegiado al que Jesús permitió presenciar la resurrección de la hija de Jairo (Mc 5:37), y la luz cegadora de la Transfiguración (Mc 9:2-13). ¿Cómo es que, después de su cercanía con él, no comprendieron que beber la copa que él bebería significaba que se unirían a él en el sufrimiento?

¿Recuerdan cuando Pedro trató de sacar a Jesús de ese sufrimiento, asegurándole que nunca sufriría una muerte violenta? Jesús estaba mirándolos DIRECTAMENTE a ustedes cuando le dijo a Pedro: "¡Apártate de mí, Satanás" (Marcos 8:33)!

Esta bien. Habríamos pensado lo mismo. Después de todo, ¡mira todos los milagros! Pero seguramente se dieron cuenta, esa terrible noche en Getsemaní, cuando una vez más fueron señalados, junto con Pedro, para permanecer despiertos y orar con él (Marcos 14: 32-36), y vieron que cuando él oraba, rogaba que la copa le fuera retirada, esa copa debe ser terrible. ¿Y recordaron, entonces, cómo una vez le habían rogado que les compartiera esa copa?

No sabemos cómo murió, Juan. La tradición dice que vivió una larga vida y murió en Éfeso. Pero tú, Santiago, fuiste apedreado por orden de Herodes Agripa I. Según la tradición española, tu cuerpo fue llevado a Santiago de Compostela, donde tu santuario atrae a peregrinos cristianos de todo el mundo. Y la copa del sufrimiento continúa para los mártires incluso hoy.

¿Qué copa de sufrimiento aceptas todos los días?
