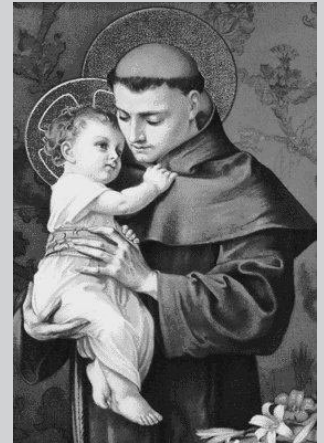

THE BREAD OF LIFE

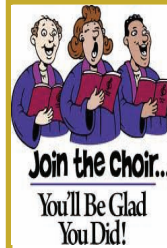
Today we resume the "Bread of Life" discourse from John's Gospel that began two weeks ago. He makes reference to the Jews' ancestors who ate manna in the desert. These days we would think primarily of Israel wandering in the desert, but faithful Jews would also have known the story of Elijah that we hear today. Strengthened by food and drink in the desert, the angel of the Lord sends him on his forty-day and forty-night journey (the biblical number for a preparation time). Like the food given to Elijah in the desert, Jesus tells his listeners that he is bread for the life of the world. It is very important that we not stop listening to Jesus after his promise of eternal life—a marvelous promise, but this "reward" is not the only reason we feast on the Bread of Life. We also come to the table to be made strong for the journey of mission, that the whole world might have life in the fullness of Christ. We are compelled, if we have eaten of the bread of life, to go forth in service to all.

RE: Long Term Facility & Retirement Home Residents
On July 24th, 25th and 27th, 2018. I administered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to all the Catholic residents at Royal Oak, Chartwell and Southgate in Kingsville and Harrowood in Harrow. It has been my practice of visiting and anointing each of the residents **twice a year** to be certain that in the case of declining health or emergency, they have received the Rites of the Church. Those anointed are the ones whose names are identified as being Roman Catholic. Following my visit with them, I inform the staff that they have received the Sacrament and in the event of family members requesting the Sacrament for their loved one they will be informed of my earlier presence to them. If I receive a call requesting a visit to anoint, I check my list of residents and note when they were last anointed. When new residents arrive I will see them soon after. If you have any questions or concerns, please give me a call. *Fr. Rick*

A MINUTE IN THE CHURCH

For Catholics, attending Mass on Sunday (or a Saturday evening) is not optional. It is an obligation. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews addressed this in Hebrews 10:25—*"We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another"*. The Catechism of the Catholic Church in paragraph 2818 explains why. *"The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice."* As Catholics, we believe that the Mass is the highest form of prayer and worship. The faithful should know that deliberately missing Mass without a serious reason is a mortal sin. This is explained in the Catechism, paragraph 2181. *"For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin."* *In going to Mass on Sunday, we follow the Third Commandment to keep holy the Sabbath.*
