Dear Saint Anselm School Families,

We thank you for continuing to trust our school community to be able to safely educate your children while we are in the midst of a global pandemic. As medical professionals continue to state, the most beneficial place for your children is to attend school in-person during this crisis even if it may look slightly different. We are grateful for the flexibility and creativity of St. Anselm School Principal, Mrs. Geraldine Murphy, the teachers and staff, and we appreciate the many sacrifices and precautions taken by our students and their families.

Given the pandemic, nearly all of our school fundraising has been canceled, postponed, and/or significantly altered. In previous, “normal” years, our school community has come together with incredible generosity for our Carnival, Night at the Races, Oktoberfest, Car Show, Bingo, and Quizzo, among others. Not only are those tremendous opportunities for camaraderie, but they also drive incredible supplemental income for our school.

Since the above challenges have significantly impacted our bottom line, we have made the difficult decision to increase tuition for the 2021-2022 school year by \$150 per student (\$15/month). This decision was made only after numerous and varied discussions. It is expected that the total cost of educating your child in the 2021-2022 school year will be \$6,720 of which only a portion of this cost is covered by tuition. Our Parish Family that contributes to the Church’s weekly collection subsidizes nearly 20% of your child’s education.

Like many individuals and businesses, the last year has presented us with many financial hardships. Nonetheless, we have done everything we could to not alter your children’s scholastic experiences. We have every intention of continuing to deliver a first-class, in-person, Catholic education and this additional monetary support will help us in accomplishing these goals in the short and long-term.

We thank all of you for choosing Saint Anselm School for your child’s education and continue to pray for the continued health and safety of you all.

May God bless you for the many sacrifices you make to provide a Catholic Education for your child(ren).
