Practice saying the books as you play.</p>	<p>Puppet Show</p> <p>Pick a Bible story and put on a puppet show for your younger siblings.</p> <p>Easy ways to make puppets: utensil puppets or sock puppets.</p>	<p>Movie</p> <p>Find a video of a Bible story and watch with your family.</p> <p>This could be a video you have (<i>Prince of Egypt, Veggie Tales, etc.</i>) or you can look online.</p>	<p>Story Share</p> <p>Pick your favorite Bible story and turn it into a picture book for younger children.</p>
<p>Illustrate a Bible Verse</p> <p>Pick a verse from the Bible that you can <i>see</i>.</p> <p>Write the verse on a piece of paper and illustrate it. Make me see what you see.</p>	<p>Joseph's Dreams</p> <p>Read the story of Joseph, Genesis 37.</p> <p>Have you ever been hurt by a friend, sibling, or cousin?</p> <p>Write a letter forgiving them.</p>	<p>Joseph Forgives</p> <p>Read the story of Joseph, Genesis 41-45.</p> <p>Joseph knew it was important to forgive his brothers.</p> <p>Take a picture with your family.</p>	<p>Esther</p> <p>Read the story of Esther.</p> <p>Esther is the most talked about woman in the Old Testament. Find another story about a woman and compare her to Esther.</p>	<p>Saints!</p> <p>Saints are people who have given their lives to living out God's word.</p> <p>With your parents, look up some saints online or in a book. Who is your favorite?</p>
<p>The Beatitudes</p> <p>Read Luke 6:20-23.</p> <p>What can you do to help those in need? What do you think Jesus expects of you?</p> <p>Write a to-do list for this summer.</p>	<p>Disciple Search</p> <p>Pick one of the twelve disciples and research their journey. When did they meet Jesus? What did they do after the resurrection?</p> <p>Create a timeline of their journey.</p>	<p>Take a picture of yourself with your BINGO board to begin playing!</p>	<p>Hero Search</p> <p>There are many "heroes" in the Bible, but which is your favorite?</p> <p>Find your favorite story and make a poster. Include why you think they are a hero.</p>	<p>Read</p> <p>Read a book with a Christian message.</p> <p>Take a picture of yourself with the book and the message.</p> <p>Suggestions provided upon request.</p>
<p>The Last Supper</p> <p>Read Luke 22:7-20</p> <p>As a family, sit down to your own version of the Last Supper. Challenge yourself to look up a traditional Passover meal.</p>	<p>Prayer Journal</p> <p>Use a notebook or loose papers to make a prayer journal. Decorate the cover.</p> <p>Write a prayer in your journal each night. What would you like to pray for?</p>	<p>Prayer Chain</p> <p>For one week, work on a prayer chain.</p> <p>Cut strips of paper for a paper chain. Each day, write a prayer on a strip and connect the chain. This is a good family activity.</p>	<p>The Widow</p> <p>Read Mark 12:41-44.</p> <p>Make your own offering box for giving.</p> <p>Make a plan to remind yourself to fill the box.</p>	<p>Confirmation</p> <p>Using your research skills, what is Confirmation?</p> <p>Create your own definition and explain why it is an important sacrament.</p>
<p>Why go to church?</p> <p>Make an advertisement telling people <i>why</i> they should go to church.</p> <p>Why is it important? What do you receive by going?</p>	<p>My Favorite Verse</p> <p>What is your favorite Bible verse?</p> <p>Make a sign with the verse on it and decorate it to show what the verse means to you.</p>	<p>First Reconciliation</p> <p>Using your research skills, what is First Reconciliation?</p> <p>Create your own definition and explain why it is an important sacrament.</p>	<p>Washing of the Feet</p> <p>Read John 13:1-20</p> <p>As a family, sit down and wash each other's feet.
