

MOST HOLY TRINITY

CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Summary

Most Holy Trinity is offering a 2.5 year Youth Confirmation Program that begins typically in 9th Grade, receiving Confirmation in the Fall of their 11th Grade year, culminating with a capstone Mission Trip during Spring Break of their 11th Grade year. **Our goal is to form Missionary Disciples of Jesus Christ.**

Each year of their Confirmation preparation, they will **1) meet for weekly formation, 2) attend a yearly retreat, and 3) participate in at least one service project per semester.** Over the course of the 2 years, they will also study the Youcat (Youth Catechism), and **4) turn in one homework assignment per semester,** beginning in their second semester.

The first two years, there will be an additional Sacramental Prep cost of \$50, along with the general Faith Formation cost of \$55. Cost should never hinder registration. Scholarships are available where needed.

CONFIRMATION 2 (TRANSITION YEAR)

We are in the process of transitioning the time frame of when the youth will be confirmed. In this year, if your child is beginning **Confirmation Year 2 in 11th or 12th grade**, they will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in **Spring 2022**. If your child is beginning **Confirmation Year 2 in 10th grade**, they will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in **Fall 2022**. In other words, the second group of youth will be receiving Confirmation the Fall of their Junior year (one semester earlier).

Sacramental Records:

Please bring a copy of your candidate's Baptism and First Eucharist certificates to the Most Holy Trinity parish office or at youth group ASAP. If your youth was baptized or made first communion at Most Holy Trinity, you must call the MHT office and request that a copy of the certificates be given to the youth office. If your youth received their sacraments at another church, you must call that parish and have them send you a copy or send/email a copy to

YEAR 2 (10-12 Grade)

Overview

Confirmation Candidates in Year 2 begin with the Kerygma Retreat. This year will dive more deeply into Sacred Scripture and Morality, including a study of John Paul II's Theology of the Body. They will have weekly meetings on **Sunday's 4:30-7:30pm** which include formation, discussion, Eucharistic Adoration, and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Youth will need to choose a Sponsor (a faithful, Confirmed Catholic who the candidate knows and looks up to in the faith) in the Fall semester. Sponsor and youth will attend 2 Sponsor Sundays.

Curriculum

Morality/TOB (Spring), Youcat part 4

Requirements

- Attendance required at Confirmation class each **Sunday from 4:30-7:30pm.**
 - Maximum of TWO (2) excused absences are allowed per semester**
 - 2 tardies = 1 absence** (tardy = 15 minutes or more late)
- Attendance & **service** at weekly Sunday Mass (6:30pm)
- Serve in Liturgy: Altar server, sacristan, usher, or music
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a semester
- Attend **Kerygma Retreat Fri-Sun, Sept 3-5, 2021 at Camp Kappe**
- Attend both **Sponsor Sundays (with Sponsor) 1-7:30pm**
 - Dec 5, 2021 (Sponsor Information Sheet Due)**
 - Mar 27, 2022 (Saint Report Due)**
- Youcat (Part 3) Homework due Oct 24, 2021**
- Youcat (Part 4) Homework due March 27, 2022**
- Serve at one service opportunity (minimum 3 hours) per semester
- Turn in paperwork by due dates

YEAR 3 (10 Grade)

Overview

Year 3 is the Missionary Disciples year! If they were not Confirmed in the Spring, Candidates will be Confirmed in Fall 2022. They will serve as missionary disciples within the parish at Youth Alpha **Wednesday's 6-8:30pm** of the Fall semester. In the Spring of Year 3, the Confirmation Program will culminate in a capstone Mission Trip over Spring Break to Guatemala (or locally in Houston). This year is their chance to begin to put their faith into practice, and to share the Gospel with those who have not heard it.

- Serve at Alpha Youth each **Wednesday from 6:30-8:30pm.**
 - Maximum of TWO (2) excused absences are allowed per semester**

- Attendance at weekly Sunday Mass
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once a semester
- Youcat (Part 1) Homework due Oct 26, 2022**
- Capstone Mission Trip, Sunday-Friday of Spring Break 2023**

YOUTH CONFIRMATION REQUIREMENTS

The Archbishop (Cardinal DiNardo) has established the 10th/11th grade as the specific period of time for preparation and reception for the sacrament of Confirmation. It must be understood that not all young people mature and develop at the same rate in their moral, faith, or intellectual development. Different people possess differing degrees in their understanding, appreciation, and response to God's love. Confirmation models for this Archdiocese are constructed to address adolescent candidates who are in these grades.

QUALIFICATIONS OF THE CANDIDATE

Each baptized Catholic has the right and the obligation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, but the candidate has the responsibility to personally choose to complete initiation into the faith life of the Church. The candidate may request the Sacrament if he/she:

- is baptized and able to renew baptismal promises unless a grave reason suggests otherwise
- exhibits an active faith life and knowledge of the Church
- participates in the sacramental life of the Church, especially Eucharistic liturgies
- is willing to commit to active involvement in the parish Confirmation catechesis
- is willing to respond to the call of active ministry
- is willing to continue to learn and grow in faith following Confirmation and throughout his/her lifetime
- has received the most holy sacrament of the Eucharist and leads a life of faith consistent with the teachings of the Catholic Church. ***“To receive Confirmation one must be in a state of grace. One should receive the sacrament of penance in order to be cleansed for the gift of the Holy Spirit. More intense prayer should prepare one to receive the strength and graces of the Holy Spirit with docility and readiness to act”*** (CCC:1310).
