### BEFORE COMING TO GIFT

- Catechist/Mentors will complete a self-screen
- Parents should screen students for COVID-19 related symptoms. These include:
  - A fever of 100.4°F or greater
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Cough
  - Headache
  - Sore throat
  - Chills
  - Muscle pain and fatigue
  - Diarrhea, vomiting, nausea or abdominal pain
  - Loss of smell or taste

**Catechists, students or parents should not enter the campus if they have tested positive for COVID-19 or if they exhibit one or more of the symptoms listed above that cannot otherwise be explained.**

### WHILE ON THE CAMPUS

- All adults and students should wear a mask upon entering any building
- Each participant should report directly to their assigned meeting room
- Meeting rooms will be arranged to allow for socially distancing
- Each participant will have an assigned seat
- Masks may be removed once seated (unless otherwise requested by catechist/mentor)
- Catechists/Mentors may remove masks as long as they are distanced by 6 ft.
- When moving about before and after GIFT Night sessions (or during if using the restroom), masks should be worn and appropriate distancing in single file line should be maintained
- Participants may bring water bottles, but no snacks should be shared
- During dismissal masks should be worn as participant walk to vehicle (do not gather in the gym)

### EVIDENCE OF POSITIVE CASE

- If a participant were to become symptomatic while attending GIFT Night, they should be sent immediately to the Director of Religious Education (in the gym or call 812-621-1127) and will be sent home and encouraged to get testing or seek advice from personal physician
- Positive cases will be reported to the local health department & the Archdiocese of Indianapolis
- We will follow the protocol set forth by the Indiana State Board of Health [https://www.coronavirus.in.gov/files/20\\_Parent%20screening%209-4-20.pdf](https://www.coronavirus.in.gov/files/20_Parent%20screening%209-4-20.pdf) unless the local health department feels different protocol should followed
- We will assist in contact tracing with the local health department and communicate to parents the protocol that should be followed regarding quarantining at home
- Communication to families and the community will occur via email when a case is confirmed and a phone call to those considered close contacts will be asked to quarantine for up to 14 days
- Those testing positive must isolate for 10 days from the date symptoms began and be 72 hours fever-free without fever-reducing medication and improvement in respiratory symptom before returning
