



STEWARDSHIP IN SCRIPTURE

John the Baptist, such a pivotal part of the Gospel. There were baptisms performed by other "groups" where it signaled an initiation into the membership in that group. We know John the Baptist had followers, today's Gospel gives us a vignette of their experiences. What separated John from others was his recognition of Jesus as the promised one. In Christian history, after Jesus' resurrection, the Church continued to baptize but with an important difference. Jesus instructed, people then, as today, are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son Holy Spirit. Water is still used but the sacramental presence of Jesus asks that the one being baptized recognize this truth (or his/her parents for infants). John preached repentance, asking for recognition of one's failures and a commitment to reform. The Gospel describes the willingness of different types of people to hear and believe John's message. So much so that they wondered if he himself could be the promised one. Lest there be any confusion, John clearly dispels any thought of his own prominence. He had little regard for any of life's trappings; he lived an austere life ... pointing to the one who would follow him, Jesus. It may seem a little too much to assume but we are to emulate John the Baptist. We grow in faith and our ability to share it publicly. We are called to pass on faith but in doing so we need to avoid any sense of self importance: like John the Baptist we are to point to the one who came after him, Jesus. Most us won't live in the desert or eat locusts and wild honey, at least not physically. But having that spirit is a big help in tamping down our assessment of what is important in our faith journey. John the Baptist, like the prophets before him, spoke the truth about our relationship with God and with one another. When asked what "the crowds" should do. John emphasized the need to be men and women for others. Placing the needs of others before any excesses we desire for ourselves focuses us on being Christ for one another. In a larger sense, John the Baptist is our Advent guide, calling us out of daily diversions, asking that as we anticipate the Christmas miracle we place ourselves in the posture of the shepherds who recognized and came to revere him. We too are called to worship Jesus, the living God who beckons us. Even with our graced knowledge of who Jesus is we are called to stand in awe of God come among us as one like us. Understanding of that gift is beyond us but lives lived patterned after love incarnate call us to be love also.

SIMBANG GABI

Our Fil-Am community invites you to join us in this wonderful tradition of the Simbang Gabi which our parish will celebrate both on December 15 and 22, 5:30pm. This tradition began in 1587, Fray Diego Soria, a missionary to the Philippines, petitioned the Pope for permission to hold Christmastide Masses outdoors because the church could not accommodate the multitude that attended the services. The request was granted and thus, Simbang Gabi became a Filipino spiritual tradition. Vatican II encouraged the church in the Philippines to continue the tradition and uphold its significant role in the life of the people, to express the love of the people for God through His Mother Mary. Filipino Americans brought Simbang Gabi to the U.S. and found it to be an effective way to stay connected to their faith and enables them to share their God-given gifts with the wider Church in the United States.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Los cristianos latinos tenemos unos cinco siglos en nuestra trayectoria de fe y como todo cristiano aguardamos la segunda venida del Mesías, Jesús. Nuestra espera forma parte de dos milenios de cristianos que buscan verlo llegar en las nubes.

Desde el siglo VII la oración oficial de la Iglesia clama el retorno de Cristo con las exclamaciones llamadas las "Antífonas Oh". Estas llaman a Jesús pidiéndole que venga bajo los títulos de Emmanuel, Sabiduría celestial, Señor de gran poder, Vara de Isaí, Llave de David, Alba de la luz, y Deseo y Rey de gentes, y algunos más. Estos refranes se usan aún todavía hoy durante los días 17 al 23 de diciembre, y unidas en un acróstico latino forman las palabras *ero cras* (estaré mañana), como respuesta a la petición cristiana. Eventualmente en el siglo X o XI estas antífonas fueron unidas en el canto gregoriano Veni, veni Emmanuel (Oh ven, oh ven Emmanuel).

Este adviento mientras cantamos las antiguas antífonas hay que preguntarnos si de veras estamos listos para el regreso del Hijo del Hombre que viene para juzgar a vivos y muertos.

Hay dos domingos en el año que se permite usar el color rosa en la vestimenta y estos son el cuarto domingo de Cuaresma (laetare) y el tercer domingo de Adviento (gaudete) porque en medio de la "espera", se recuerda que ya está próxima la alegría de la Pascua o de la Navidad, respectivamente.

En la corona de Adviento también se suele encender una vela rosada.


SAN VICENTE DE PAUL



REJOICE!

Today has traditionally been called "Gaudete Sunday." The Latin tag is derived from Paul's appeal in the second reading to "rejoice always in the Lord," and the Latin Mass text based on that reading. The irony and paradox of this Christian joy is underlined by the fact that Paul wrote those words in prison. But from there he could see the progress of God's work.

Is it obvious to us? We feel that this is not the time for joy when there is so much suffering and moral evil. It is interesting, then, that the first reading is from the prophet Zephaniah, who is almost exclusively concerned with gloomy visions of Judgment Day. Today the Church selects the only optimistic text in Zephaniah, in which the prophet has been touched by the spirit of joy.

This, we are assured on all sides, is "the season of joy." Let us recapture that feeling of joy in our lives and reflect it to those who are joyless.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Years ago, the trick question on religion quizzes would be to name all the liturgical colors, or the colors of the vestments worn at Mass. Rose is a color seldom seen, used at most two days a year. Today, "Gaudete Sunday," is one of those days. The name of the day is drawn from an opening verse in the old Latin Mass texts: *Gaudete* is Latin for "Rejoice!" This year's Gospel certainly reflects that mood as Elizabeth feels her infant within her leaping for joy at the presence of Mary. Mary's visit to her aged cousin is an act of compassion between women, as two kinswomen who are bearing children into the world share their joy.

Some churches retain the custom of having the priest wear rose vestments today, and many will use a rose candle in the Advent wreath. Violet is the official color for Advent and Lent, but many parishes employ different hues for each season, trying to keep them distinct. In medieval times, dye was costly, and poor parishes used unornamented plain cloth for vestments. Dyes were expensive and some colors, particularly purple, difficult to achieve. In England, purple dye was made from mollusks, yielding at best a deep indigo or blue and not the desired violet. Thus, the color of Advent in the British Isles has long been a deep blue, reminding many people of Mary's presence at the heart of the Advent mystery. That theology is largely unplanned: it's all because of the clams!
