



RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK



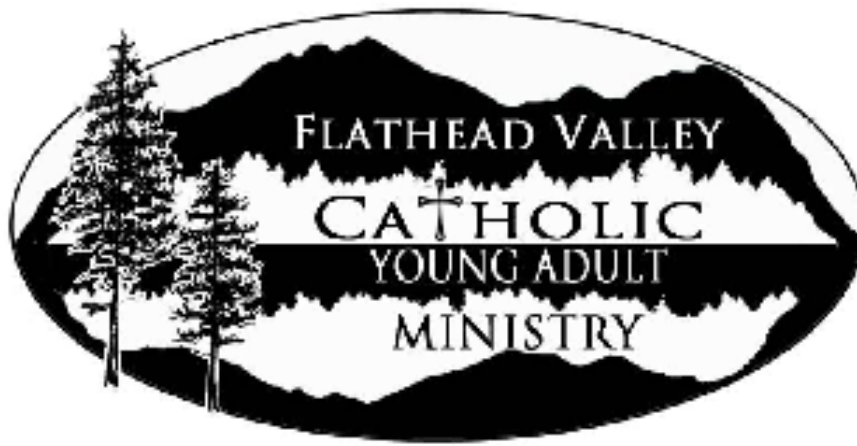
