



Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

“For my Flesh is True Food, and my Blood is True Drink.”

The sole purpose of the feast of Corpus Christi is to focus on the Holy Eucharist. Due to COVID-19, we will not celebrate with the procession of the Eucharist like we have in the past, however, I would ask that you spend some time in prayer today asking for a greater ability to see the face of Christ in others. Spend time in front of the Blessed Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. Then say a prayer for 5 random people that you pass throughout your day.

Confirmands, Congratulations to all of you receiving the sacrament of Confirmation this week. We are excited for you, your parents, catechists and your godparents. You have been preparing together for this very important sacrament that will play a significant role in your spiritual journey and your relationship with Jesus Christ. Confirmation is the sacrament by which Catholics receive a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Through Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives them the increased ability to practice their Catholic faith in every aspect of their lives and to witness Christ in every situation. ... A closer bond with the Catholic Church. Here's what happens at the actual ritual of Confirmation: ... The bishop anoints you by using oil of Chrism (a consecrated oil) to make the Sign of the Cross on your forehead while saying your Confirmation name and “Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.” You respond, “Amen.” The bishop then says, “Peace be with you.”



The use of the Chrism Oil is very significant. The anointing of those who are called or

chosen has a long and deep symbolism, going well back into the Old Testament. Those who are anointed are set apart, cleansed, healed, and strengthened. They are also said to be "sealed," marked with the sign of the one in whose name they are anointed. By some accounts, the earliest known documented account of chrism being used in official sacramental ceremonies dates back to St. Cyril in the late 4th century CE, but it is likely to have been used for centuries before that.

“Consecrated oil is always a sign of God’s mercy. So, the meaning of priestly anointing always includes the mission to bring God’s mercy to those we serve. In the lamp of our lives, the oil of mercy should never run dry.”

— **Pope Benedict XVI**

It is the desire of the Catholic Church that through the Holy Sacrament of Confirmation the Confirmand will build on what was begun in Baptism and what was nourished in the Holy Eucharist. Then complete the process of initiation into the Christian community, and mature the soul for the work ahead.

It is equally important that the parents, family and Godparents provide the support of praise and worship through the practice of regular reconciliation, mass and receiving the Holy Eucharist with the Confirmand. You continue to be in our prayers for Jesus to remain in your hearts and actions.

and/or waiting, you may do so. So, if your child was in the First Communion class this past year and qualified to receive the sacraments in May and June but would prefer to wait until things are more open, they may contact us at the office to schedule a better time
