

Confirmation Sponsors

It is time for the Confirmation students to determine who their sponsors are going to be. Keep in mind they can have **only one sponsor** unless they choose to invite their original baptismal sponsors. Take time to consider whom you can go to for guidance on your faith journey, whom you can look to as a role model in living the Catholic faith. The sponsor should be at least 16 years of age, be a practicing Catholic who has already received their Sacraments of Baptism, First Confession, First Communion, and Confirmation. If the sponsor you choose is married, their marriage must be blessed by the Catholic Church. The sponsor cannot be one of your parents. Additionally, your sponsor will have to get an affidavit from their parish stating they are Catholics in good standing and turn the affidavit in to the parish office.


We will not be renewing parking passes this year! Please keep your **2020** passes posted in your cars. Thank You!

“Speak, for your servant is listening.”

My dear spiritual Family of San Felipe de Neri, the Gospel of this 2nd Sunday in ordinary time presents us with an account of the encounter of the disciples of John the Baptist with Jesus, thus showing us the form and manner that we will develop our ordinary time. It identifies Jesus as the teacher, the Messiah, the Lamb of God and at the same time shows us the identity of the true disciple, the one who meets Jesus, recognizes him, makes his life fully available and follows him faithfully.

The text of the Gospel (Jn 1:35-42) is a beautiful catechesis of vocation and testimony that shows the discovery made by the disciples of the identity of Jesus. This finding will be revealed little by little throughout the whole Gospel, from his works and words, and especially from his death on the Cross and his Resurrection.

Saint John, the Baptist, recognizes Jesus as the Lamb of God, of whom he had said before that he takes away the sin of the world (Jn 1:29). Jesus has received the baptism to destroy all evil, all sin with his death and conquer it forever with his glorious life. Jesus is the one who truly eliminates the sin of the world, all sin of this world, from the most personal to the most structural sin, since all sin annihilates the human being. Envy, selfishness, greed, lust, all the deadly sins, corruption, violence, lies, injustice, and inequality, are the ultimate cause of the economic crisis that sweeps away like an avalanche.

It is not enough to know about Jesus in a light and simply curious way, but it is necessary to know him in depth, living with him, sharing his word and his table, spending time with him and checking, from the experience of the living and cordial relationship with him and with his gospel, that he is the Messiah, the one who had to come, the one who has the ability to change the course of people and guide them towards a different life as happened to Simon, who, with the change of name gives another mission, another identity. An example of the true knowledge and following of Jesus, in addition to that of the disciples, is the experience of the vocation of Samuel (1Sm 3:3b-10.19) who was learning to recognize the voice of God through help and Eli's experience of faith, but it was he himself who responded to the voice of the Lord in a personal way: “Speak, Lord; your servant listens to you ”

Thus, our life of faith and sincere and faithful following of Jesus is made up of people who help us to recognize the presence of God, like Eli, like John the Baptist, like our parents, our catechists, our parish family, but each of us, personally and individually, must listen to his voice and follow him as Samuel did, as Simon did.
