**RE: Low Risk Exposure to COVID-19 at Saint Clare of Assisi Church – 150 St. Francis Avenue - Vaughan**

York Region Public Health was recently informed of a low-risk COVID-19 exposure that took place at a Saint Clare of Assisi Church – 150 St. Francis Avenue - Vaughan.

The exposure occurred on **October 3, 2021 from 1 pm to 3:15 pm.**

You are receiving this letter because you and your guests were identified as low-risk contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 at the location noted above. Common symptoms of COVID-19 can include fever (temperature of 37.8°C or greater), new or worsening cough and shortness of breath. Other symptoms include sore throat, difficulty swallowing, loss of taste/smell, nausea /vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, runny nose, or nasal congestion (in absence of underlying reason for these nasal symptoms such as seasonal allergies, post-nasal drip, etc.). These symptoms can appear within 14 days after last exposure to the person infected with COVID-19.

#### What should I do now?

- If you are feeling well and have not experienced symptoms as described above, between **October 3** and end of day **October 13, 2021, no action is required.**
- If you are currently experiencing symptoms, it is important that you self-isolate and seek medical assessment and testing, even if you are fully vaccinated.
- If you have experienced symptoms as described above, it is important that you immediately seek medical assessment and testing, even if you are fully vaccinated.
