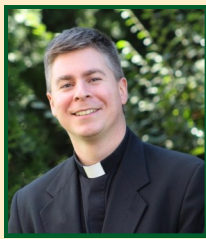

A Message From The Pastor...



Dear friends,

One of the many parables found in the Gospel of Luke is of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Jesus reveals that while both pray, the Pharisee is content with his own righteousness, while the Tax Collector humbly beats his breast, and says: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" (Lk 18:13). Jesus said: "...the latter went home justified, not the former; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted" (Lk 18: 14). As Christ praised such a prayer, the earliest Christians sought to imitate the Tax Collector's petition and would say a prayer known to posterity as the "Jesus Prayer".

The prayer is succinct: "Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner". While short, the prayer is no less profound. The petition contains the Holy Name of Jesus, a name when invoked causes every knee to bend in adoration (Phil 2: 10). Furthermore, Jesus is called the "Christ", or the Messiah—that is the Anointed One of Israel whom all of the Prophets predicted would come and liberate God's chosen people. What is more, He is called the Son of God. As such, the one who prays such a prayer confesses like St. Peter: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" (Mt 16: 16). All the same, the prayer acknowledges our own sinfulness before God and begs for His mercy. Indeed, the Lord desires to forgive sins, as He taught the disciples to ask for forgiveness in their prayer to the Father.

As we gather for Holy Mass this Sunday, perhaps we could adopt this prayer. As we seek the Lord, we humbly express sorrow for our sins, while trusting in the abundant mercy of God. Receiving the Lord Jesus Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament, may we enter into this coming week and continually call upon the One we have received today.

Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Relying upon the prayers of Mary, Mother of the Church, St. Peter, and indeed All the Saints, I am faithfully yours in Christ Jesus,

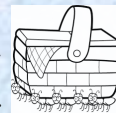


Summer Lighting Collection
