A Message From The Pastor...

Dear friends,

Last week, we looked at the first part of the "Hail Mary". We examined how this prayer takes two verses verbatim from the Gospel of Luke. For example, we hear both Mary's



encounter with the Archangel Gabriel, as well as Mary's visit with her cousin Elizabeth. In addition to uttering passages from the Gospel, each time we pray the Hail Mary, we call upon the Holy Name of Jesus.

The prayer continues: *Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.*

We call Mary "holy". Holiness is the perfection of charity. Indeed, because Mary is overflowing with God's grace, she can certainly be called "holy". What is more, we call her the Mother of God. She is given this title precisely because of the one whom she bore in her womb. Jesus Christ is fully God and fully man. As such, Mary gave birth to the God-man, not simply to the human Jesus. In calling Mary, the Mother of God, we are not declaring that Mary somehow came before the creation of the cosmos. Rather, we are declaring that the fruit of her womb is Jesus Christ who is truly God.

In view of such an awesome mystery, we acknowledge our reality as sinners and so we ask for her to pray for us, just as we would ask other people in our lives to intercede on our behalf. We ask Mary to pray for us as we utter such a prayer, but also in that time of our final travail—the hour of our own death.

The Hail Mary ends with "Amen". Amen is one of the few Hebrew words which has survived in our prayers. It literally means: "may it be so".

Today, we acknowledge our need for forgiveness. We humbly call upon the angels and saints, especially Our Mother Mary and ask them to intercede for us. As we pray, we recall the abundant mercies of God. Approaching the Holy Altar, may we receive the One whom Mary carried in her womb—the God-man. As we receive Him, may He embrace us and overwhelm us with His love. Amen.

Relying upon the prayers of Mary, Mother of the Church, St. Peter, and indeed All the Saints, I am faithfully yours in Christ Jesus,
