A reminder on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi of the required preparation for the reception of the Most Holy Eucharist:

Before receiving Holy Communion, one should abstain for at least one hour from all food and drink except water and medicine (see Canon 919 par.1).

One who is conscious of serious sin should not celebrate Mass or receive the Body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess. In this case the person is bound to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the intention of confessing as soon as possible (see Canon 916).

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. — 1 Corinthians 11:26

Let others in your life know how and why it is vital for you to be an active and participating Catholic by sharing about your frequent Mass attendance. Invite them to come along with you! Many highly influential Catholics today are converts or 're-verts' who came to a deep faith by the Holy Spirit 'awakening' them when they came to a Mass!

Once, St. Teresa was overwhelmed with God's Goodness and asked Our Lord, "How can I thank you?" He replied, "ATTEND ONE MASS."

Think about what happens when an unplanned, but necessary, expense comes up in your life. Perhaps you can manage it through your normal income. Or maybe you need to dip into a savings account. Possibly, you may even need to take out a loan, or borrow from someone in your life who has the financial wherewithal.

Now think about what happens if your income isn't enough to manage the emergency costs, maybe even despite your holding of two jobs. What if you have no savings, or have already run through that source, and still need more help with the emergency costs. And what if your family is disenfranchised, or low income also, or you're simply alone in the world? Then what? The bills still need to be paid - both the everyday bills as well as the unexpected ones. And if your credit is not good enough to be able to obtain a loan, where can you possibly turn?

Many people, more than you may perhaps realize, find themselves in this type of situation, and in this type of need. They still need groceries on the table, and they still need to replace a mattress and boxspring so old that the springs are painfully poking out. They still need to be able to afford gas for their car, or money for the bus, so that they can get to their job that doesn't pay enough for their minimal expenses, especially when life is interrupted by an unplanned emergency.

This is where your donations for the "5th Sunday 2nd Collections" (held at both St. Margaret of Scotland and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton parishes) come in. Our local St. Vincent de Paul conference members talk to people in this type of need weekly. Our food pantry assists people like this regularly. Thank you for any and all dollars you can prayerfully contribute to alleviate some of the stress of those who are less fortunate than you.

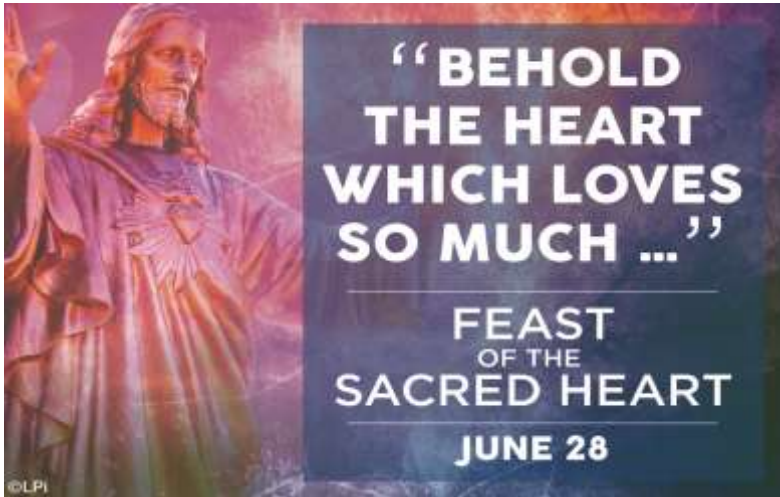

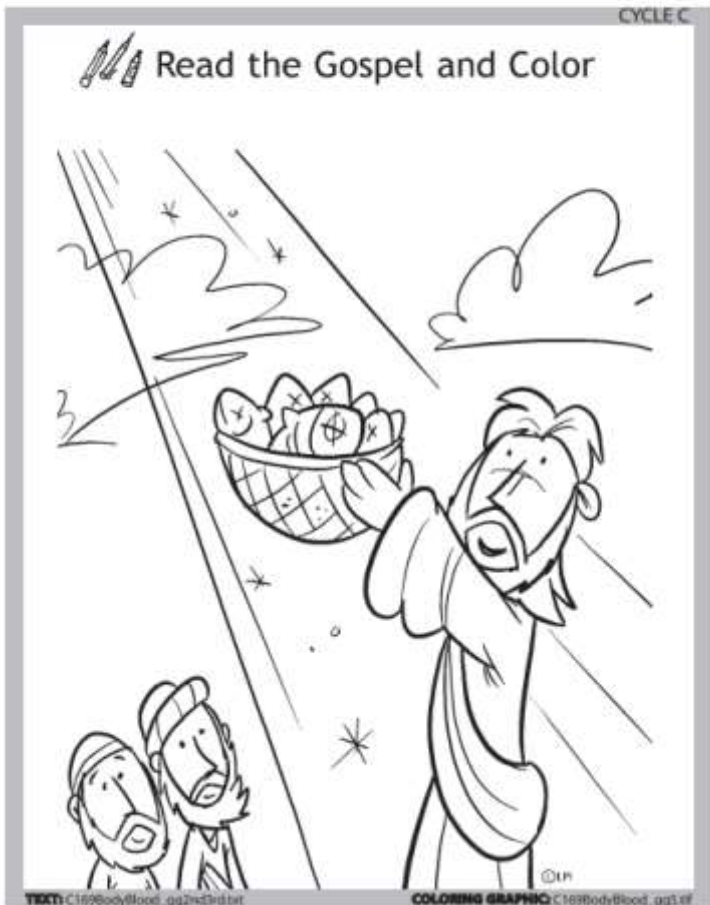

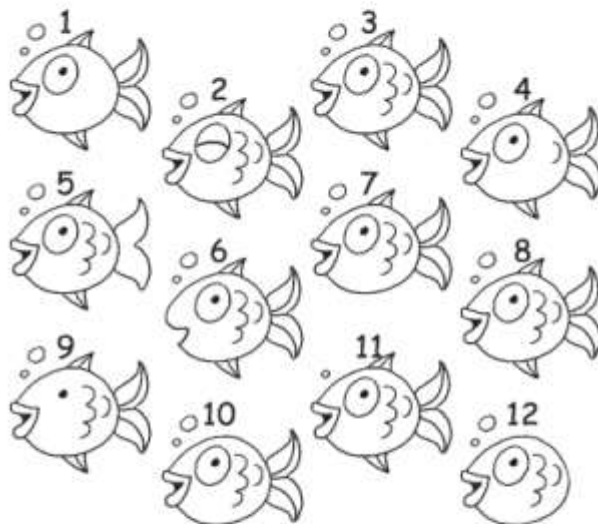
