Here is what to expect when we return to Church the weekend of September 12-13, 2020.

- + Diocesan and State Policy requires that you **wear a mask** at all times.
- + **Sanitize** at the hand station **on your way in** and **sanitize on your way out**.
- + Please **avoid sitting in the same pew with a different group** other than your own. If there is not enough room, we will open additional pews.
- + You will **remain in your pew** for all of Mass. For **Communion**, the Eucharist **will be brought to you in your pews**.
- + Please be sure you are **not sitting** in a pew that says **“no seating” or is roped off**. There should be no one in the pew immediately in front of, or behind you. This ensures **adequate social distance** and a smooth flow during the distribution of Holy Communion.
- + During Communion, **stay right where you are. Leave your mask on and receive communion in the hand**. Wait for the minister to move to the next person **before** removing your mask and receiving Communion. We unfortunately **cannot communicate Precious Blood** per Diocesan Policy.
- + The Offertory **will not be collected during Mass**. There is a **basket in the back of the Church**. May we suggest that you place your collection in the basket before Mass.
- + Sadly, there is **no physical sign of peace**. Please give a **wave** to your neighbor.
- + We also **cannot encourage congregational singing per Diocesan and Medical recommendations** at this time. Please do not use any of the hymn cards or hymnals that are set aside.
- + It is ok to sit, stand, and kneel.
- + Please **do not enter the sanctuary** unless instructed to do so.
- + When you leave, **please do not congregate in the Church**.

Mass Recordings

We will begin **livestreaming** both Masses (**Saturday 4pm and Sunday 11am**) once we re-enter the Church. Livestreamed Masses are **automatically saved on Youtube** to watch anytime. **Weekday Masses** will **remain the same** for now being **streamed at 8am**, and a **public daily Mass in Cummins Hall at 5:30pm** Monday-Friday.

Pending Process for Lectors

The following is a draft of our procedures for Lectors. Please contact Kim Hoover at the Rectory if you would like to volunteer.

Because we need to keep areas sanitary and safe, we need to make a few adjustments. Please see below:

Sign-up and be assigned in advance. We will make a schedule once we know who is available.

One Lector per Mass: Options are **4 pm Vigil and 11 am Sunday**. It is critical that if you cannot make it, you let us know. We will reassign someone. **No volunteers waking up during the Mass.**

You **cannot be a Lector AND a Eucharistic Minister**. You will be assigned one or the other.

You must be **masked** the entire time **except for when you are doing the readings**.

The Lector will not walk in with the book of Gospels. You can walk in carrying the lectionary. The book of Gospels will already be on the altar.

As you walk in, when you get to the foot of the altar, **proceed to the right side, so you can bow and then take a seat near the right pulpit** (this is opposite of where you normally sit).

The Lector will **stay on the right side of the sanctuary** (right = when you are facing the altar from the pews). You will **have your own pulpit** and will remain on the right side of the altar for social distancing and to avoid sharing microphones/pulpits.

Remain at your seat for Communion. Father will bring Communion to you.

Lectors will not give announcements at the end of Mass.

Walk out as normal at the end of Mass (except you will exit directly back to the sanctuary).

Pending Process for Eucharistic Ministers

The following is a draft of our procedures for Lectors. Please contact Kim Hoover at the Rectory if you would like to volunteer.

Because we need to keep areas sanitary and safe, we need to make a few adjustments. Please see below:

Sign-up and be assigned in advance. We will make a schedule once we know who is available.

Options are **4 pm Vigil and 11 am Sunday**. It is critical that if you cannot make it, you let us know. We will reassign someone. **No volunteers walking up during the Mass.**

You **cannot be a Eucharistic Minister AND a Lector**. You will be assigned one or the other.

You must be **masked the entire time, including when you are distributing**, except when you are receiving Communion.

You will not walk in with the procession. Remain in your pew, hopefully located near the front of the church.

At the **Lamb of God**, walk up to the **foot of the altar. Do not enter the sanctuary**. Wait near the communion rail in front of the ambo.

Disinfect your hands with the sanitizer on the Communion rail (you will not receive Communion now as you will **receive at the end of distribution**)

There **will not** be a Communion line. You will bring Communion to the congregation **as they remain in their pews**. You will **walk through the pews** in between the congregants (every other pew will be empty)

At the **end** of Communion, **sanitize your hands** again by the Communion rail and **Father will give you Communion**. Sanitize your hands again and return to your pew.

****If at anytime during distribution you come into physical contact with someone who is receiving, you must stop and sanitize your hands.***
