

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I mentioned last Sunday in my homily: everybody needs a vacation, and everybody needs to feast! I hope you all will get a little time away this summer, most of all in order to spend time with family members and friends. But there's one thing we should never take a vacation from: worshiping God! It can be difficult at times to find a Mass when we're travelling. Thankfully, there is a great resource that has been around for some time: **masstimes.org**. Using this website, you can search by city, state, or zip code, and it will list all the parishes within a given mile radius. It's a great help, and I recommend it.

I'll be gone this weekend, as my family is coming out from Seattle, and we'll be going to North Carolina for a few days. So we'll pick up the Ten Commandments when I return, on July 28<sup>th</sup>.

As we go through the Ten Commandments this summer, it's good to rehearse our own memory of the list of those commandments. As you may know, the Ten Commandments are actually numbered in two different ways, depending on whether one uses the first listing in Exodus 20, or the second listing in Deuteronomy 5, changing whether one reads the prohibition against graven images as part of the first commandment, or its own separate commandment, and whether the commandment against coveting is distinguished between a neighbor's wife and his property, or the two are combined into one.

Most Protestants follow the listing of Exodus, while Catholics have always followed the list provided by St Augustine, who followed Deuteronomy 5, as do Lutherans.

Need help memorizing them, here's a good tip:

- 1. Hold up one finger- God should be first-- No other gods before him.
- 2. Hold up two fingers- This forms a V for vain-- Don't use the Lord's name in vain.
- 3. Hold up three fingers- This forms a W for worship-- Sundays are for worship and rest.
- 4. Use four fingers to salute- Honor your Father and Mother.
- 5. Use five fingers to make a fist- Don't kill.
- 6. Use three fingers on each hand to form a heart- Don't commit adultery.
- 7. Hold up two fingers on one hand, use all five fingers on the other to grab the two fingers- Don't steal.
- 8. Use four fingers on each hand to form binoculars over your eyes- Don't bear false witness. This also forms the number 8 when you take them off your eyes and turn them sideways.
- 9. Hold up the ring finger (other nine are down)- Don't covet neighbor's wife.
- 10. Use all ten fingers to cover your eyes- Don't covet neighbor's goods. God bless,

### TEN GOOD REASONS TO GO TO MASS

In case you missed any:

- 1) God asked us to make one day holy-When we go to Mass each week we begin to see everything from a different perspective. We have an opportunity to reconnect spiritually.
- **2)** Jesus gave us the gift of himself-When we go to Mass we are doing what Jesus asked us to do at the last Supper, when he instituted the Eucharist.
- **3)** We need to be part of a community-God treated us as social beings. When we come together at Mass to pray and worship God, we fulfill a deep need inside of us to be a communion with other people.
- **4)** God has a special message for us-When we listen to the homily, the readings and the prayers of the Mass, God speaks to us in a special way. We should come away from Mass with at least inspiration that will impact our lives in some way.
- **5)** We need to talk to God-When we go to Mass, we speak to God when we sing, when we join in the communal responses and prayers and when we pour out our personal prayers to God from the depths of our hearts.
- 6) People need our prayers-We can pray for people anytime, but when we pray for others during Mass, we pray in a special way. It doesn't matter if the other people are separated from us by distance or death. The Mass brings us together in the Body of Christ and we all become the communion of Saints.
- 7) We stand up for what we believe-At every Mass: we have the opportunity to stand and proclaim what we believe publicly. It is a powerful statement ands a way to recommit ourselves.
- **8)** We know we make mistakes-We have the opportunity to review the past week. We admit to God that we have sinned ion thought, word, in deed, in what we have done and in what we have failed to do. We seek forgiveness.
- 9) We need to experience something bigger than ourselves-When we go to Mass, we share in the death and resurrection of Jesus. We are strengthened by the Eucharist and sent out into the worlds to bring the Gospel message to al people.
- 10) We need ritual in our lives-Mass is a ritual, which means that through the repetition of our prayers, the movements, and the changing of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ we are formed.
