1) **The resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith.**

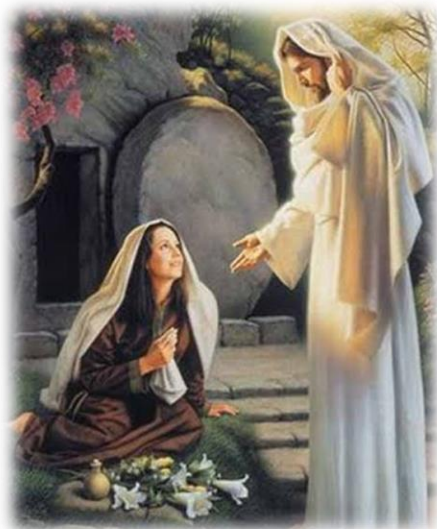
2) **Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection.** Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the Resurrection and the life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies" (Jn 11:25-26).

3) **Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement.** In this world of pain, sorrows, and tears, Easter reminds us that life is worth living. It is our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven, that gives meaning to our personal, as well as to our common prayers.

The Divine Mercy Novena

Jesus asked that the Feast of the Divine Mercy be preceded by a Novena to the Divine Mercy which would begin on Good Friday. He gave St. Faustina an intention to pray for on each day of the Novena, saving for the last day the most difficult intention of all, the lukewarm and indifferent of whom He said:

"These souls cause Me more suffering than any others; it was from such souls that My soul felt the most revulsion in the Garden of Olives. It was on their account that I said: 'My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass Me by.' The last hope of salvation for them is to flee to My Mercy."

In her diary, St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her: "On each day of the novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls."

The different souls prayed for on each day of the novena are:

[DAY 1 \(Good Friday\)](#) - All mankind, especially sinners

[DAY 2 \(Holy Saturday\)](#) - The souls of priests and religious

[DAY 3 \(Easter Sunday\)](#) - All devout and faithful souls

[DAY 4 \(Easter Monday\)](#) - Those who do not believe in Jesus and those who do not yet know Him

[DAY 5 \(Easter Tuesday\)](#) - The souls of separated brethren

[DAY 6 \(Easter Wednesday\)](#) - The meek and humble souls and the souls of children

[DAY 7 \(Easter Thursday\)](#) - The souls who especially venerate and glorify Jesus' mercy

[DAY 8 \(Easter Friday\)](#) - The souls who are detained in purgatory;

[DAY 9 \(Easter Saturday\)](#) - The souls who have become lukewarm.

During the Solemn Novena leading to Divine Mercy Sunday, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy should be offered each day for the day's intentions.
