On the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, (September 15) we will renew our three parishes and renew our own personal consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Bishop Quinn renewed the consecration of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester to the Immaculate Heart of Mary at the Sunday morning 10:30 am Mass at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Winona on September 8th. The Diocese of Winona-Rochester was first consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 2008, and it is our diocesan tradition that we make this renewal every year on the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as an act of love and devotion to Our Lady. At the very moment of His conception in her womb, Jesus entrusted His whole being to her. Similarly, by this act of consecration, we allow Mary to actualize her mediation in our lives, enriching our diocese with many graces. All the parishes of our diocese also make this consecration to Mary during the month of September.

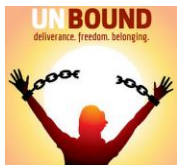


Soul Friends: We will meet on **Tuesday, September 17th at 2:00 PM** at the St. Adrian Education Building.

The Pastor's Corner:

The message in today's scriptures is forgiveness, leaving the ninety-nine sheep in the wasteland and following the lost one until he is found. Our model is the father of the prodigal son, who forgives the past and welcomes his dead son back to life. Our task is to reconcile. St. Paul writes, for "the Good News of the reconciliation God has entrusted to us."

In the reading from Exodus, we hear God's decision to abandon Israel and to form a new nation founded upon Moses himself. Moses says that he has a better idea. He reminds God of two things. God has a history of power and care for Israel which would be forgotten if He abandons them. Then Moses reminds God of the promise made to the great servants of God, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, so God relents and is merciful to Israel. We've always been mostly fascinated by the Prodigal Son story through the almost impossible love of this almost impossible father who runs down the road to greet the prodigal son. What a father. No rancor at all in his soul. Only concern and love for the ungrateful son who was forced to return because he had been reduced to eating with the pigs, a penalty unheard of for an Israelite. We see in this parable that forgiveness is a gift of grace.

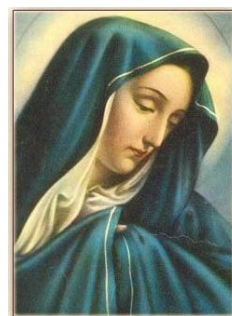
