## **The Pastor's Corner:**

**Today's readings take up the demands of faith.** The opening verses of Habakkuk are a dialogue between God and the prophet about the perennial problem of evil. The people had suffered ruthless domination under one government; now a new power under King Nebuchadnezzar was to be no improvement. The frustration is clear, "O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?" (Habakkuk 1:2). God's answer is this: Vindication and relief will come to those who wait patiently in faith. Luke gathers sayings of Jesus describing the faith required of disciples. The disciple must not be an occasion of sin (17:1-2) but must be willing to forgive those who have sinned (17:3-4). The apostles plead for the strength required to do these things; Jesus replies that faith (17:6) even as tiny as a mustard seed will make incredible accomplishments possible. Dialogue with God is required, even when the reply is in the form of a vision as yet unfulfilled. Courage is needed to apply the Christian message to our time without benefit of a vision. God is present yet hidden, compassionate yet demanding, just yet merciful, powerful yet gentle.

**As I am on the Diocesan pilgrimage to Greece from October 8 to October 18, In the Footsteps of St. Paul:** I welcome from Food For The Poor next weekend 10-13 Fr. Vernon Arseneau, celebrating at all the Masses about a ministry providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and all the Caribbean. Greece will be a wonderful experience of the scriptures of St. Paul in the land he walked. I will remember you all in my prayers at Masses in the shrines sites where St. Paul preached.

#### **The Story of Our Lady of the Rosary ~ October 7<sup>th</sup>**

*Saint Pius V established this feast in 1573. The purpose was to thank God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716.*

*The development of the rosary has a long history. First a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of praying 150 Hail Marys. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving of the rosary to Saint Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of Saint Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century, the rosary was developed to its present form—with the 15 mysteries: joyful, sorrowful and glorious. In 2002, Pope John Paul II added five Mysteries of Light to this devotion. ~Franciscan Media*
