The Pastor's Corner:

We welcome Fr. Vernon Arseneau who will speak at all the Masses this weekend about a ministry providing direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and all the Caribbean. Father Arseneau will share personal witness about **Food For The Poor's** mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another. It is fitting that Fr. Vernon is here this weekend, as our scripture readings speak of our care for the poor and being grateful for all we have received.

Giving thanks should be a way of life. Even in those times when we feel forgotten and neglected, the gift of life itself demands gratitude. The readings today remind us to put aside concentration on self, open our eyes to the goodness within and around us, and give praise for giftedness. The episode from the Second Book of Kings recounts the cure of the Aramean general Naaman through the intercession of the prophet Elisha. Naaman is healed of his leprosy and thus confesses his faith in the God of Israel and offers a gift as a sign of his gratitude.

Luke portrays a merciful Jesus responding to the oppressed of his society, namely, ten lepers. Gratitude, like charity, should begin at home. These biblical passages make us humble as we remember all the kindness shown through the years. The love of parents and other family members is the first and greatest recollection. Frequently our gratitude can take the form of imitation. Where we have received sympathy, support, and concern, we can give the same to others. In this way the generosity of the giver is not lost but perpetuated. The spirit of the Scriptures inspires praise and thanks for each and every gift we have received.



Footsteps of St. Paul Pilgrimage: As of today, we have celebrated Mass at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Thessalonica where St. Paul wrote two epistles. We went on to the Church of St. George, the White Tower and the churches of St. Demetrius & St. Sophia. We arrived on Friday at Kavala where Paul, Silas, Luke, and Timothy first set foot in Europe. Then we left for Philippi on Saturday where Paul first preached the Gospel on European soil. Then it was on to Athens for the panoramic city tour to view the most important highlights of the city of Athens, including the Tour the Acropolis Site, Parthenon, and Acropolis Museum. On Monday, it is on to Corinth and Bema where Paul spoke to the Corinthians (*Acts 18:1-17*). I will remember you all in our daily Masses and Adoration Holy Hour during our diocesan Pilgrimage.
