COMFORTING THOSE WHO MOURN: Grieving is a natural part of any type of loss. Whether we lose a job, a loved one, or a friendship, we go through a time of mourning the loss of what once was. When losing a loved one our grief and mourning will be determined by our unique abilities to deal with uncomfortable or traumatic experiences. We all deal with grief in ways that works for us, and the time it takes to work through the varying emotions and feelings will be unique to each person experiencing it. But sometimes grief can become complicated which makes it harder to work through. Some things that may complicate grief are: the status of our relationship to the deceased, our attitudes and views toward death, our ability to handle trauma, or the circumstances of the death.

At our parish cluster, we have a wonderful grief workshop that has helped many people move through their grief journey in a healthy way. **The workshop is called "Grieving with Great Hope" and it consists of 5 sessions (once a week) which last about an hour and a half each.** Part of the sessions includes watching a DVD in which we hear stories from others who have lost loved ones as well as helpful information on grieving and what to expect and how to do it well. There is an opportunity for participants to share their feelings, however it is never forced. I would like to hold the workshop **beginning March 1 on Sunday afternoons at 2:00 PM**. Physician Assisted Suicide Myth: People can't afford pain management medications. Physician Assisted Suicide is a dignified out. **Truth:** For people over 65, hospice care is covered by Medicare. The VA and Minnesota Medical Assistance, as well as most private insurers, also cover hospice care. **Catholic compassion:** If people are struggling with the costs of health care or signing up for Medicare, please contact Catholic Charities or your county's social services. However, hospice care is covered by Medicare, and cost should not be a consideration. And we never want to encourage assisted suicide as a substitute for decent health care—we want to fix the health care system where it is broken. No one deserves an early death sentence due to their finances.

The Pastor's Corner:

Today's scripture readings talk about the importance of being God's witness. They stress the importance of being a witness to God and, in turn, revealing God to others. Isaiah discusses the witness role of Israel. The exiles returning to their homeland will be a clear sign of Yahweh's power. Even in moments of exhaustion, their discouragement must be cast aside, so that God's glory might be displayed. Yahweh will be the strength the people require. The fourth gospel never mentions Jesus' baptism by John. In this gospel, rather, John the Baptist is John the Witness. In today's reading, he identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God, as the Preexistent One, and as the Giver of the Spirit. The final verse of the gospel reading notes, "And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God" (John 1:34).

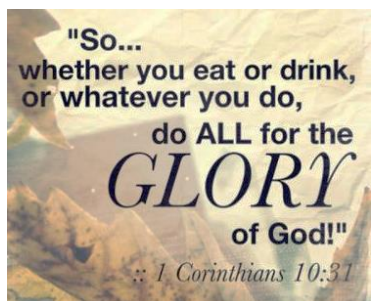
