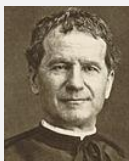

**COMFORTING THOSE WHO MOURN:** Grieving is a natural part of any type of loss. Whether we lose a job, a loved one, or a friendship, we go through a time of mourning the loss of what once was. When losing a loved one our grief and mourning will be determined by our unique abilities to deal with uncomfortable or traumatic experiences. We all deal with grief in ways that works for us, and the time it takes to work through the varying emotions and feelings will be unique to each person experiencing it. But sometimes grief can become complicated which makes it harder to work through. Some things that may complicate grief are: the status of our relationship to the deceased, our attitudes and views toward death, our ability to handle trauma, or the circumstances of the death. At our parish cluster, we have a wonderful grief workshop that has helped many people move through their grief journey in a healthy way. **The workshop is called “Grieving with Great Hope” and it consists of 5 sessions (once a week) which last about an hour and a half each.** Part of the session includes watching a DVD in which we hear stories from others who have lost loved ones as well as helpful information on grieving and what to expect and how to do it well. There is an opportunity for participants to share their feelings, however it is never forced. **Physician Assisted Suicide Myth:** People want to die with dignity, before they lose who they are. **Truth:** Dying with dignity means honoring that people never cease being wholly themselves, regardless of declining abilities. **Catholic compassion:** Men and women are beloved sons and daughters of the Father, and that does not change with disability or illness. The language about “losing who they are” suggests that being human is measured by our abilities, and when we lose them, we lose the self. Losing abilities is hard and calls for friendship and compassion. But the human being created in God’s image never loses that identity. To die with dignity is live until God says it is time to go, supported by your brothers and sisters in Christ.

**The Pastor’s Corner:**

**“It is better to light one little candle than to curse the darkness.”** Light and darkness symbolize tension in human living: presence and absence, hope and despair, love and hate. Today’s readings present the human and divine experience of light and darkness. They reveal a God whose first biblical words are “Let there be light” (Genesis 1:3). They challenge us to be producers of light, not architects of darkness. In the gospel, Matthew uncovers the beginning of Jesus’ mission to the Gentiles. This is important for Matthew because his own community is made up of both Jews and Gentiles. Matthew uses a prophetic text in which the pagans overcome darkness by experiencing the light emanating from Jesus’ message.

**On September 30, 2019,** on the liturgical memorial of St. Jerome, Pope Francis announced that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time would be celebrated as the Sunday of the Word of God. The inspiring full text can be read on this site:
