COMFORTING THOSE WHO MOURN: Grieving is a natural part of any type of loss. Whether we lose a job, a loved one, or a friendship, we go through a time of mourning the loss of what once was. When losing a loved one our grief and mourning will be determined by our unique abilities to deal with uncomfortable or traumatic experiences. We all deal with grief in ways that works for us, and the time it takes to work through the varying emotions and feelings will be unique to each person experiencing it. But sometimes grief can become complicated which makes it harder to work through. Some things that may complicate grief are: the status of our relationship to the deceased, our attitudes and views toward death, our ability to handle trauma, or the circumstances of the death. At our parish cluster, we have a wonderful grief workshop that has helped many people move through their grief journey in a healthy way. **The workshop is called “Grieving with Great Hope” and it consists of 5 sessions (once a week) which last about an hour and a half each.** Part of the session includes watching a DVD in which we hear stories from others who have lost loved ones as well as helpful information on grieving and what to expect and how to do it well. There is an opportunity for participants to share their feelings, however it is never forced. Physician Assisted Suicide Myth: There are some ways of living where the person would be better off dead. If they want that, we should facilitate that. **Truth:** This is a quiet way of insulting and threatening millions of people living with disabilities. Every national disability rights organization in the USA (15 of them) has come out against physician assisted suicide legislation. **Catholic compassion:** If someone says they would be better off dead, tell them that is not true, their lives have meaning, and offer them help finding a counselor. If the person is living with disabilities, include and welcome them. If they are bound to bed and cannot communicate, bring community to them. Many people’s lives are deeply enriched by relationships with friends and family with disabilities. All human beings are beloved in the eyes of God and we are called to be friends to each other.

The Pastor’s Corner:

The Church celebrates the Presentation of the Lord every year on February 2nd which is 40 days after Christmas. This year February 2nd happens to fall on a Sunday. Because the feast of the Presentation is such an important mystery of Jesus’ life, when this date falls on a Sunday, the readings and prayers for the corresponding Sunday in Ordinary Time are set aside

Joseph and Mary presenting Jesus in the Temple seems like a simple act of worship, but it foreshadows the end of Jesus’ earthly life. Joseph and Mary are handing over the child in their care to God the Father. Their presentation is an act of honesty and humility: they’re admitting that this child is God the Father’s from the beginning, and they’re admitting that for them to be entrusted with this child is an honor they don’t deserve, but they say yes to God’s plan.
