The Pastor's Corner:


This Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is Good Shepherd Sunday. The emphasis in today's readings is on the sheep and their welfare. The shepherd is the means to ensure the end: the well-being of the flock. Sheep are first, shepherds last. In the Bible and the ancient Near East, "shepherd" was a political title that stressed the obligation of kings to provide for their subjects. The title connoted total concern for and dedication to others. In today's famous psalm of confidence, the author speaks of Yahweh as his shepherd. Yahweh is loyal to the sheep, the people of Israel.

John's gospel portrays Jesus as the life-giving shepherd. Jesus meets us in the immediacy of the here and now, in all of the highs and lows of our life, even when we get ourselves stuck in tight places and when we are under threat from the wolves. It also suggests that in the depths of our hearts we have the canniness to recognize his voice and to follow with assurance and trust that he will see us right. Jesus as the Good Shepherd, also gives a model for those who are leaders in the Church, particularly for those who are called to the priesthood. They present a dynamic model of engagement, of walking amongst the people of God. This is a good weekend to pray for vocations in the Church and for good Shepherds that will care for their flocks.

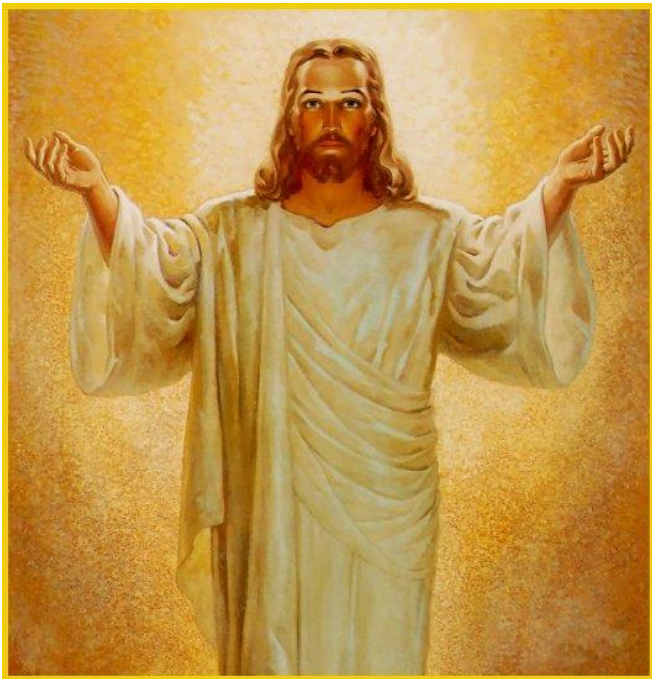
