The Pastor's Corner:

Today's gospel is the turning point in the ministry of Jesus. After Peter professed his faith in Jesus that He was the "Christ" / Messiah and "the Son of the living God", Jesus appointed him to be the first Pope! Jesus gave him the keys of the kingdom of heaven, so that whatever he binds on earth will be bound in heaven and whatever he loose on earth will be loosed in heaven! Today we believe that our present Pope Francis is a direct successor of St. Peter the first Pope in an unbroken line of 266 Popes over 2000 years. We also believe that our Bishops are the direct successors of the Twelve Apostles. That is why at every Mass we pray for our Pope and Bishop, even mentioning their names. "Who do you say I am?" We know Peter's inspirational response: 'You are the Son of the living God'. We know the varied response from our gospel today: *John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or one of the prophets. And Jesus asks us the same question.* Knowing Jesus enables us to plummet the depths of God's wisdom and knowledge.
