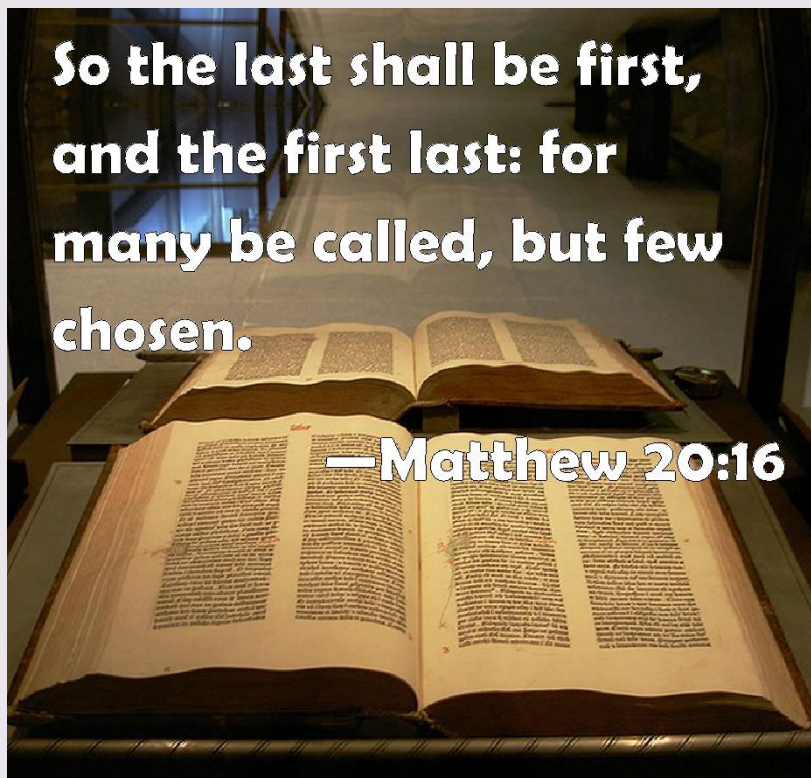


TWENTY- FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Day of Prayer and Fasting for God's Mercy on the Country and the Healing and Conversion of Our Hearts: All people of good will are invited to take part in a day of prayer on fasting on **Thursday, September 24**, for the intentions of God's mercy on the country and the healing and conversion of our hearts, especially in light of the ongoing pandemic and civil unrest. On this date, we are encouraged to refrain from unnecessary spending, while also reflecting on the impact of our spending choices. Those who are able, especially between 18-60 years of age, are asked to fast until sundown as a sign of repentance. **Eucharistic Adoration will be available from 9:00AM—6:00PM** at St. Adrian Church. St. Anthony and Our Lady of Good Counsel will be open during those hours also for prayer in the presence of the Eucharist in the Tabernacle. All are invited to spend time with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament to beg for God's mercy, to bring healing and conversion, and to join in solidarity with our sisters and brothers in need.



Disaster Relief Collection: Two natural disasters have recently affected our brothers and sisters in Christ. Hurricane Laura in Louisiana and the California wildfires have created widespread destruction. Pastor's Corner:

Today's scripture readings speak of God's generosity and mercy. He chooses to give to the most unlikely and undeserving because that is the nature of God. Isaiah urges the people to repent, to have a change of heart, to return to Yahweh. Israel is slow to accept God's plan, they are skeptical that God can create something new out of the chaos of exile. How can the depressed break into song? Isaiah must teach a new way of thinking, a vision of God that gives new meaning to success and failure. Jesus' gospel parable from Matthew reminds his audience that God is free to reward merely on the basis of God's own goodness. God's generous giving of surprises is a divine paradox that invites all believers to participate in the same adventure. Today's biblical passages suggest that this invitation is a sure path to holiness.
