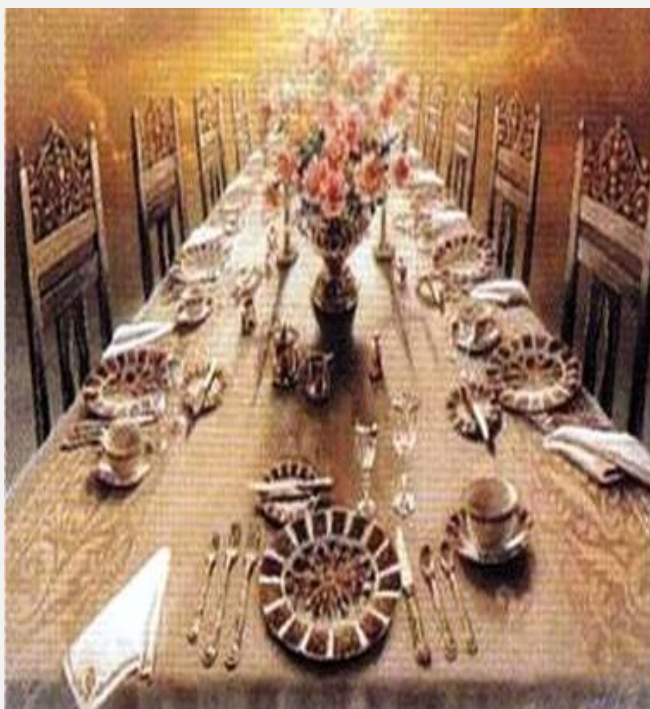

PASTOR'S CORNER

The Scriptures this weekend speak of a God who refuses to be left alone. This God nourishes and seats people at the table so that union becomes communion. Banquets and parties express this God's love. The Isaiah passage, written perhaps in the fourth century B.C., reflects a period of confusion. Yahweh is shown to be a participant in the chaotic world of Israel. Paradoxically, God enters into the community's grief by giving a banquet! Yahweh defeats death and mourning, tears are wiped away in singing. In the gospel, Jesus portrays God as a king who gives a wedding banquet for his son. Matthew develops the parable to create a view of God's involvement with people. The servants who urged the invited to come to the celebration are the prophets, the second group are Christian missionaries to the Jews. The Gentiles, brought in from outside the city, are worthy of the kingdom. The God of the Jews is the God of the Gentiles as well. The wedding feast symbolizes God's union and communion with all.
