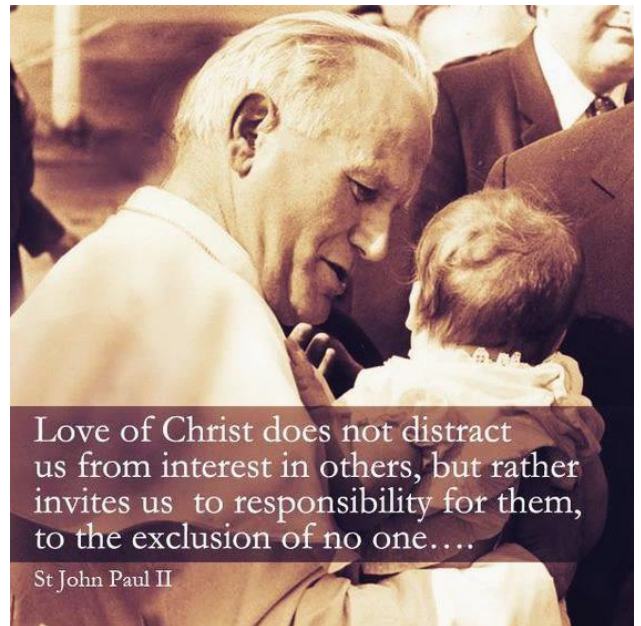


## **PASTOR'S CORNER**

**I experienced a grace filled week at the Rural Life Retreat** for priests at Green Lake, Wisconsin last week. Thank you for your prayers as my presentations went well and our retreat team felt the priests gathered from 10 dioceses and rural parishes enjoyed the retreat and got a lot out of it. In my presentations I featured some of our graced ministry moments in our parishes, like our Rural Life Celebration, the Marriage Valentine Dinner, our parish bazaars, benefits for supporting families in need, and of course our sacramental celebrations. My biggest take away from the week was summed up in the first reading of Thursday's Mass from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians: *"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as He chose us in Him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before Him."*

**Jesus offers us a profound teaching on stewardship** in this weekend's reading: What belongs to Caesar? What belongs to God? Christian stewards recognize that everything they have belongs to God. God created them, and God has claims on every part of their existence. They also realize that the sovereign is an institution whose nature and purpose is to promote the common good and protect the welfare of its citizenry. As long as it accomplishes this mission while treating every single person with deep respect, justice and compassion, it merits the steward's support and cooperation. Christian stewards know what belongs to the Lord, and they are better citizens when they live their lives according to his Gospel.
