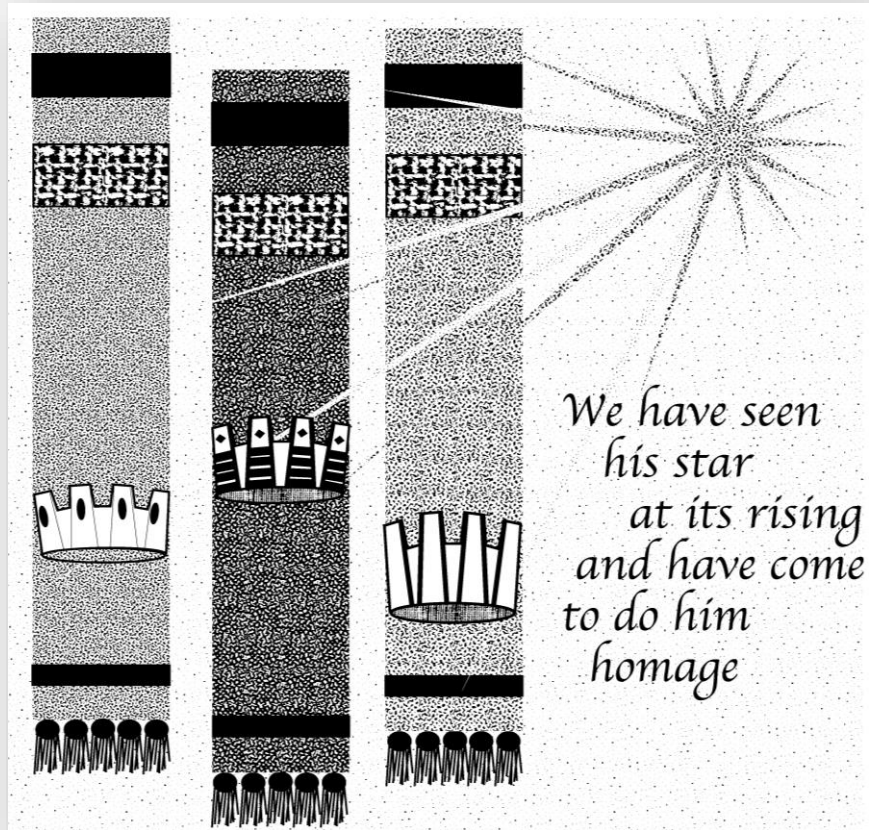


SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

PASTOR'S CORNER

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. "The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is His, and government and power." With these words, the Church proclaims that today's feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of Advent. Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical zenith of the Advent-Christmas season.

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. The Magi lead in their travels all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. In the adoration of the Magi, we see the beginnings of Christian faith in Jesus, the time when the Magi sets off to follow the star to seek its Savior.

The Magi were on a quest to find the Savior, guided only by the light of the star. We, too, are on such a journey: we constantly search for the truth about life, for the meaning of life, for "what's it all about". Unlike the shepherds, things are not clearly explained by angels appearing in the night. We have to search and journey through life like the Magi did. We have to overcome the obstacles which life presents to us: ill health, problems with our children, the deaths of our family members. And still we have to have that vision, the light which shines upon us. But it doesn't shine on us from a star in the east; it shines on us from the Cross. For it is only in the light of the Cross that all of our crosses have meaning and purpose. Otherwise, we would despair and lose our hope.

So, the Magi can teach us perseverance in the face of adversity. But they have something else which they can teach us, namely the value of community. They did not undertake their journey alone; they undertook it together. They supported one another and provided strength to one another in times of despair.

Thank you for your Christmas greeting cards, cookies, candy, and Christmas treats, and your very generous gifts to me. I appreciate your kindness during the Christmas season, and that you show me throughout the whole year. God bless you with a happy and healthy New Year 2021. As we hear in the Scriptures this weekend: "May the Lord bless you and keep you; may the Lord let his face shine upon you and be gracious to you; may the Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace."
