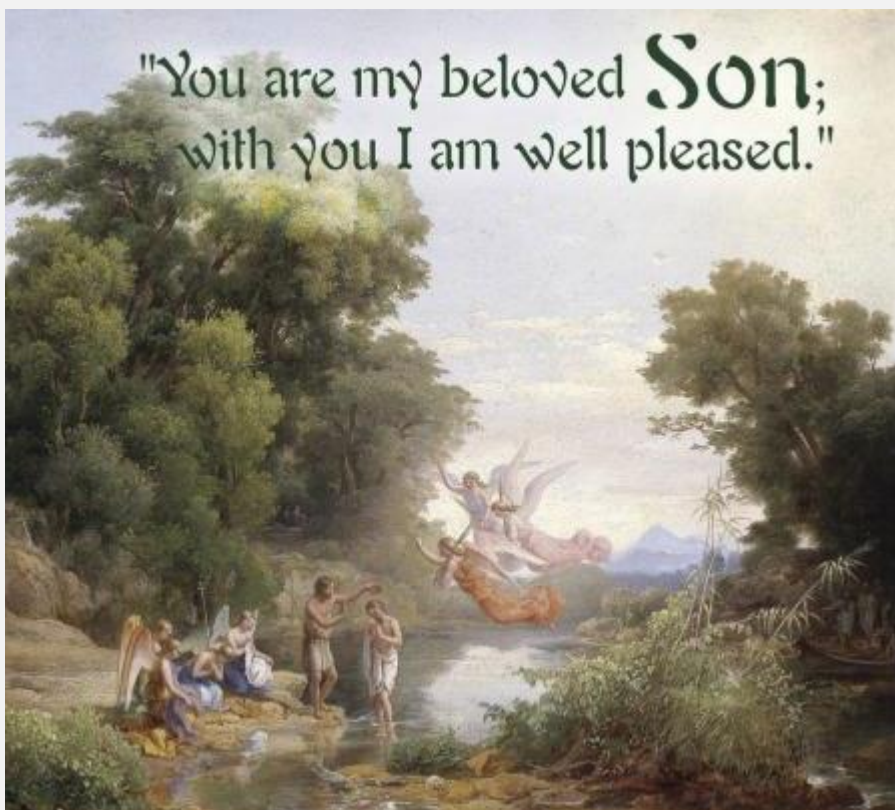


SOLEMNITY OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

PASTOR'S CORNER

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation, or epiphany, which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan. Jesus descended into the River to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons and daughters of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity is present.

The baptism of John was a sort of sacramental preparatory for the Baptism of Christ. It moved the crowd to repentance and invited them to confess their sins. Christ did not need the baptism of John. Although He appeared in the "substance of our flesh" and was recognized "outwardly like unto ourselves", He was absolutely sinless and impeccable. He conferred upon the water the power of the true Baptism which would remove all the sins of the world: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him Who takes away the sin of the world".

The Father's voice from heaven shows that Jesus of Nazareth is the eternal Son and the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove shows the Trinitarian nature of the Christian God. The true and unique God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, shows Himself in Christ, through Him, with Him and in Him.

HEALTH MINISTRY INFORMATION



STRESSED? TAKE A BREATH: Did you know practicing simple breathing exercises helps you use your lungs better by getting in touch with your natural breathing rhythm? Conscious breathing also helps lower your blood pressure, controls harmful stress hormones and improves your mood. Try one of these techniques to center your mind and release everyday tension. 1) Sit in a comfortable position. Take a deep breath in through your nose and hold for several seconds. Breathe out through your mouth as you relax with each breath. Repeat three to 10 times. 2) From a standing position, bend forward from the waist with your knees slightly bent and let your arms dangle close to the floor. As you take a deep breath in, return to a standing position by rolling up slowly, lifting your head last. Exhale slowly as you return to the original position, bending forward from the waist. © 2018 inHealth Strategies, LLC / Avera.org/livenow
