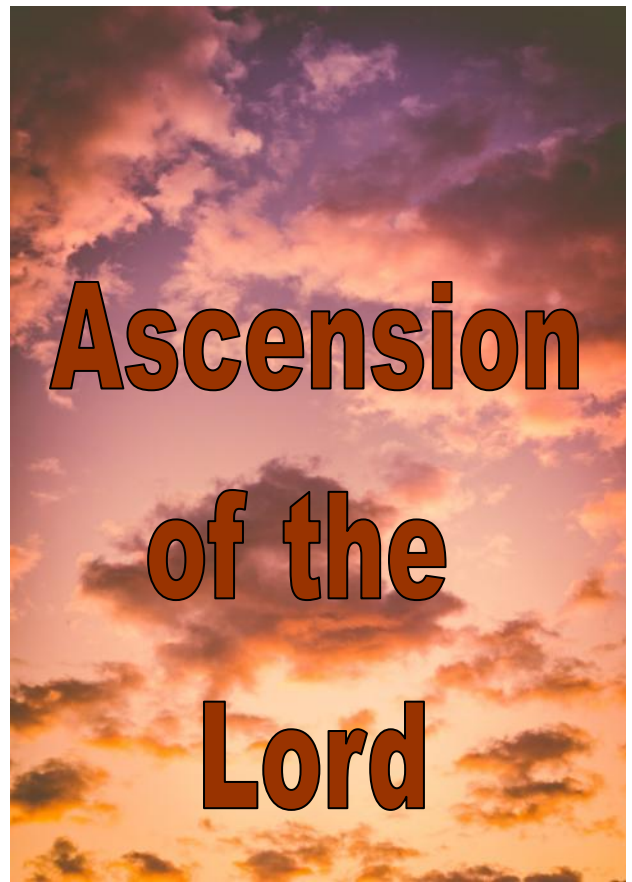

## Pastors Note ~ Ascension 2019

This feast marks a crucial hinge point in the history of salvation. Christ having completed his work on this earth returns to be with the Father. The work of salvation is then transferred from the direct initiative of Christ to the work of the Church in the world. This is the handover moment and it is completed by the Feast of Pentecost which marks the day when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the Apostles and the work of the Church really begins.

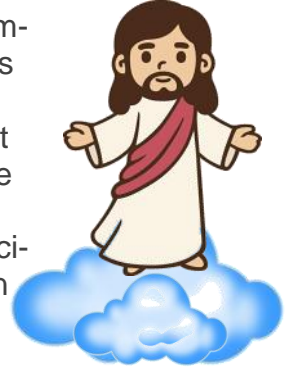
**This is a Liminal moment:** a threshold moment, a crossing –over moment, a decisive transformation from one thing to another. There are many liminal moments in life; they are often rites of passage like moving to secondary school, being confirmed, starting your first job, getting married and so on.

There are **also liminal spaces**, periods of time when we transfer from one mode of being to another. A common one is the journey to work. We have a period of time when we make the transition between our home life and our working life. These interludes are very important, they allow us pools of time when we are neither one thing nor the other; they can be particularly fruitful moments for thinking or meditation or praying. Example: in Catholic Churches we bless ourselves as we cross the threshold moving from the secular to the sacred or vice versa.

Ascension is a bittersweet day. Why? We celebrate Jesus, the Son of God, being lifted up into heaven, exalted as Lord above all creation. Also, Jesus is no longer with us in the body. Wouldn't it have been a better plan for Jesus to continue here, walking among us, among all the nations still preaching and performing miracles? Continuing to teach us how to live. Imagine what an impact that would have made over the last 2000 years!

HOWEVER, Jesus has not left us alone. He is still with us and guides us...even better He is in heaven interceding for us before the Father. Think about it, when Jesus walked the earth he was limited by his human body. He could only travel so far, and was limited by hunger, thirst, pain and wearing out. He could only do so much. BUT now! He is risen and glorified, and no longer limited. He is free to do much more!

He can comfort the grieving widow in the Ukraine, give his wisdom to those suffering in Nigeria over the loss of their child , pour out his grace and healing at every Mass being celebrated throughout the world. The Mystical Body of Christ can do all of that all over the world at all times. This will be done until the end of the world, until the end of time. Jesus has left us to continue to be his visible sign of love, compassion, and forgiveness.

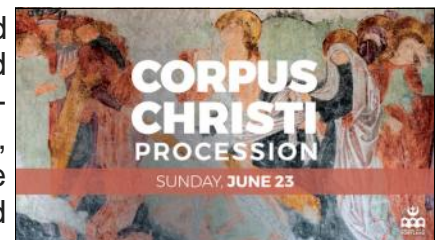

No solo cuando estoy en la misa y en las actividades parroquiales, sino también cuando estoy en el mundo, en el trabajo o en la escuela. Vivir con gratitud y generosidad es un estilo de vida; debería influir en cómo tomo todas mis decisiones diarias.

### La Buena Nueva: Scott Hahn Reflexiona Sobre al Ascensión del Señor



Lecturas: Hechos 1,1–11 , Salmo 47,2–3, 6–7, 8–9,  
Efesios 1,17–23 o Hebreos 9,24–28; 10:19–23 Lucas 24,46–53

En la primera lectura de hoy de los Hechos de los apóstoles, San Lucas nos da las maravillosas noticias que todavía hay más que contar de esta historia. No terminó todo con la tumba vacía, o con la aparición de Jesús a los apóstoles durante esos 40 días. La obra salvífica de Jesús tendría una consumación litúrgica. Es el sumo sacerdote que todavía tiene que ascender a la Jerusalén celestial, para celebrar la fiesta en el Santísimo de los cielos.

La verdad de esta fiesta resalta en la carta a los Hebreos, donde leemos que el sumo sacerdote penetró los cielos, el sacrificio del intercesor sin pecado por nuestra causa (véase Hebreos 4, 14-15). Efectivamente, esta intercesión permite la venida del Espíritu Santo en forma de fuego sobre la Iglesia. Lucas detalla esta promesa

en la primera lectura de la Ascensión: “dentro de pocos días ustedes serán bautizados con el Espíritu Santo” (Hechos 1,5). La Ascensión es la fiesta que orienta a la Iglesia hacia el Pentecostés. En ese día, se completó la salvación; pues la salvación no es simplemente la expiación de los pecados (que fuera más que suficiente), pero es algo más aun. La expiación es algo necesario para nuestra adopción como hijos de Dios. Para vivir esta vida divina hay que recibir el Espíritu Santo. Para recibir el Espíritu Santo hay que ser purificados por el bautismo. El salmo responsorial nos presenta la Ascensión en términos conocidos del culto del Templo de Jerusalén en los días del Rey Salomón: “Entre voces de júbilo y trompetas, Dios asciende a su trono” (Salmo 47). El sacerdote-rey toma el lugar principal sobre su pueblo, gobernando a las naciones, estableciendo la paz.

La epístola toma un tono algo pascual. En la Iglesia naciente, al igual que hoy, la Pascua era la temporada de bautismos de conversos ya adultos. Se le decía a este sacramento “la iluminación” (véase Hebreos 10,32) por la luz que conlleva la gracia salvadora de Dios. San Pablo, en su carta a los efesios, hace referencia a la gloria que lleva a glorias aun mayores, así como la Ascensión lleva al Pentecostés: “Le pido que les ilumine la mente” al esperar la divinización de los creyentes. Su “esperanza” es “la herencia que Dios da a los que son suyos,” los santos que han sido adoptados a la familia de Dios y que ahora gobiernan con él a la derecha del Padre.

Esta es la “buena nueva” a la que los apóstoles se les encomienda compartir al mundo entero, a todos los pueblos, comenzando con Jerusalén, en la primera Ascensión. Es la buena nueva que tenemos que compartir hoy.
