


Ask Not For Whom the Bell Tolls

The church bell routinely rings for the Angelus three times during the day, at early morning, noon and at 6 PM. The bell is also rung at funeral, and can be rung before Mass begins, and at wedding. It will be great to hear our historic bell ring again. We will keep you posted.



HOMILY SERIES: “IM POSSIBLE”, Homily Series for Easter. Join us!


