

Gospel Meditation



It begins! Jesus is doing something new. "He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea." Jesus leaves his family, his profession of carpentry, and

everything he has known and loved for the previous 30 years. He goes because it is time. Something new is beginning, and Jesus will not begin it alone. "As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers ... he walked along from there and saw two other brothers." What does he say to these men? "Come after me." These words are for Peter and Andrew, for James and for John. They are also for all of us. "Come after me." The adventure of discipleship will be strange, wild, and unexpected. The Apostles surely didn't know what they were getting into. But the invitation is accompanied by a promise. "I will make you fishers of men," Jesus tells the first Apostles. No more will their priorities be limited to this particular village, to the square miles of the Sea of Galilee. Their eyes will be open to the kingdom of God, and their priorities will shift. Most of us will not be called to roam the countryside,

Most of us will not be called to roam the countryside, but we are invited to a similar shift of priorities. "Come after me," Jesus says. "At once they left their nets and followed him." Drop the nets of what you've demanded your life to be. Drop your self-seeking priorities. Drop your concept of religion as a Sunday obligation and no more. Drop your disregard for those outside your immediate social sphere. Whatever it is that keeps you from seeing as Jesus sees, from loving as he loves, start to drop it today. Because the kingdom of God is waiting for your yes!

OPERATION STARFISH (www.stellamarina.org) is a project which began making Birthing Kits in 2010 and Newborn Kits in 2016 for the women of Haiti. The Birthing Kit is to ensure that the delivery will be clean and safe. The Social Justice and Peace Commission of Holy Spirit Parish will be collecting items for the kits, to include cloth diapers, onesies, face cloths and other necessary items for the mother. These items can be new or "gently used". Monetary gifts are also much appreciated for the purchase of medical items for the birth. To provide a woman a clean and safe delivery costs less than \$5. To kick off the gathering of needed items, **THIS** WEEKEND, JANUARY 25 & 26, AFTER ALL MASSES, ADULT COTTON T-SHIRTS WILL BE COLLECTED. They are to be new or gently used & clean. They also can be colored and can have some writing on them. Baby diapers will be made from the t-shirts. If you'd like to participate in the process, please sign up when you drop off your tshirts. Diocese of Portland Flu Prevention For Masses



*If parishioners are sick, they are asked to stay home. When ill, individuals are not bound by the Sunday Mass obligation.

*With the exception of those who receive from the cup due to medical reasons (e.g., Celiac Disease), the distribution of the shared consecrated wine for the faithful is suspended. One cup with a small amount of Precious Blood will be made available toward the back of the middle aisle of the church.

*The faithful are urged, but are not obligated, to receive Holy Communion in the hand rather than on the tongue.

*All ministers of Holy Communion are advised to be careful to not touch the tongue or the hand of the communicant.

*Parishioners should not shake hands during the Sign of Peace, but are encouraged to offer a verbal greeting, smile, or bow of the head. Parishioners should not hold hands during the "Lord's Prayer".
