From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We are now entering the last few days before we celebrate Christmas. With all the excitement of getting the last details together for Christmas we find it tempting to start the celebration of Christmas early and sidestep the ongoing penitential nature of the Advent Season. Many will be attending Christmas parties and celebrations this weekend before we actually celebrate Christmas. Human nature, being what it is we will find it tempting to skip the penance and indulge in the celebration of Christmas. Just the same, let's be patient as we anxiously await the coming of our God in the Mystery of the Incarnation. We still have a few preparations as we transition ourselves into this sacred and festive Christmas Season by doing first things first: the decorative and most especially the penitential posture of desiring to grow in greater holiness.

During the Christmas Holydays we experience an influx of worshippers. Our Masses during these Holy Days tend to be full. This is a good thing. We thank God and pray that the Holy Spirit speaks to one and all. May this Holy Season and the celebration of the Sacred Mysteries be a time for a renewal of faith and re-dedication to Christ and His Church. Mindful of the limited time left in Advent please **Note Well** the last opportunity for individual confessions. The last time will be tomorrow evening, Monday at 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m.

Secondly, let this be a reminder of our **Schedule for Christmas Masses**. This Tuesday, Christmas Eve, we will have Mass at **5:00** p.m. as well as Mass at **10:00** p.m. Attendance at these evening masses will be greater than usual and will require plenty of patience on the part of all. On Wednesday, Christmas Morning, Mass will be at **9:00** a.m. It is important to remember that we gather to worship in praise and thanksgiving for the gift of God's love in our midst: Jesus Christ. As we give thanks and praise God, we also ask for his continued blessings during this Holy Season of Christmas.

As we begin these last couple days of the fourth week of Advent, we find a couple figures looming large as we await the birth of the Messiah. Obviously, we have the figures of Joseph and his betrothed, Mary the Mother of Jesus. These two figures are models of faith in their own way. Mary, at the announcement of the Angel that she would conceive and bear a son by the power of the Most High, responded with an act of faith: "*Let it be done to me according to your word.*" Although perplexed by the word of the Angel, Mary gave her "yes".

Joseph becoming aware that his betrothed was with child received a visit by an Angel in a dream. Joseph intended to dismiss Mary quietly; not wishing to expose her to public disgrace. The Angel told him not to be afraid and to welcome Mary into his home. Joseph's act of faith was in welcoming Mary and the Word Incarnate into his home. In word and deed, Mary and Joseph responded in faith, trusting the Word that was spoken to them by the Angel of God.

We have the privilege of looking back on these events and seeing the faithful hearts of the Holy Family in action. We know the rest of the story; we know how their response played out. In patience and over time the plan of God was played out. Mary and Joseph were not mindless puppets in God's plan. No, they were human beings with the gift of "free will" who willingly consented to their role in God Plan.

However, it would be good for us to use our imagination to consider those moments in their lives. Mary was troubled at the message of the Angel. Joseph was going to quietly dismiss Mary. They were both called upon in this extraordinary situation filled with questions and challenges. But at the word of the Angel they consented to what was asked of them. They had confidence in the Word of God that was spoken to them. They were not required to understand. They were asked to have faith and trust the message of the Angel. They had confidence in the Word without knowing how their individual roles would play out.

God has a plan. Ultimately God's plan is about our salvation. Jesus Christ is the central figure in this Divine Plan. Even though Mary and Joseph were unaware of how God's plan would be played out, they had a personal role to play in this plan. All that was required of them was to say "yes" to God and let it play out. From their place in history, they had to trust even if it did not make sense to them. From their example we know the rest of the story and are encouraged to accept God's invitation to say "yes" to Him, trust His Word, and welcome Jesus Christ into our homes and lives. Where this will lead us, we do not know. We do know that this will lead us to salvation. We only need to have faith: God is trustworthy.

This is something for us to contemplate during these last days of Advent. Like Mary and Joseph, we have a role to play in God's plan for the salvation of all peoples. This plan is fully revealed in the life and ministry of Jesus Christ. This plan is announced to us and we too have a role to play. At the invitation of God, through the message of the Angel, Mary and Joseph were asked to take part in this plan. With their "yes" to the Angel, Jesus was welcomed into the world and into a family where he grew in age and wisdom before God and man. When Jesus began his ministry, he invited others to join him as he revealed God's big plan: The Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus invites us to trust his word, repent from sin and follow Him to the Kingdom of Heaven. This was and is God's plan and we are invited to share in His plan.

Like Mary and Joseph, we have a role to play in the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven. The role we play starts with our "yes" to God. God invites us, He never forces us. Our response is not to the message of an Angel; our response is to the Word of God: Jesus Christ. Our "yes" to Jesus Christ opens our lives to the coming of the Kingdom. The Kingdom of Heaven starts within our hearts.

Mary welcomed the Word of God in a very personal way when the Word was made flesh in her. Joseph welcomed Mary and the Incarnate Word into his home. Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple and to the community of God's Chosen People. The disciples accepted Jesus' invitation to join him and they welcomed Jesus into their lives. Jesus transformed their lives. His disciples in turn presented Him to the world with the proclamation of the Gospel. We are now invited to welcome Jesus into our lives as our Lord and Savior. As he transforms our lives, we witness to him in our homes, community and the world.

The celebration of the Nativity of the Lord is quickly coming upon us. There is something about this holy celebration of our Lord's birth that calls us to quiet contemplation. In these final days we need to prepare our hearts to welcome the Lord into our lives. This invitation deserves our silent consideration and reflection. This invitation seeks a response from all of us. Prompted by this gracious invitation let us welcome our Lord. May our personal "yes" to God be an acceptance of our role in God's plan. We may not directly know or fully appreciate our

personal role in God’s plan, yet our “yes” is a necessary starting point. Our “yes” to God’s Word is an act of confidence in the saving work of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On behalf of Fr. Dreese, Deacon Pete and the Staff here at St. Nicholas, I extend to one and all a Merry Christmas. May the blessings of this holy season be with you and your families. May God’s peace and joy fill your hearts as we celebrate our Savior’s birth.

Have a blessed Advent and a Merry Christmas.
