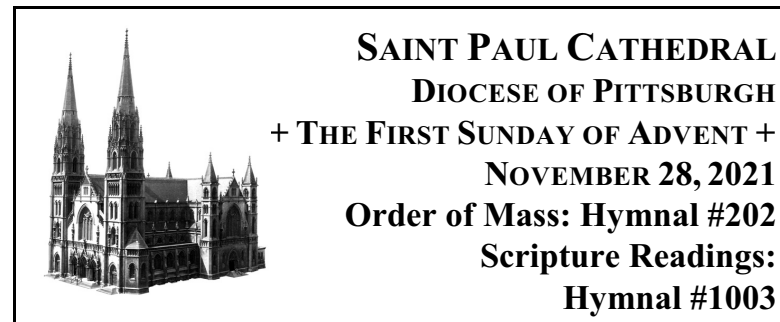
*You the Father's only Son, Have o'er sin the victory won.
