

Sixth Grade Catechesis Objectives

Upon completion, youth will be able to reiterate that:

1. The scriptures are the inspired Word of God. (CCC#105-107)
2. The Catholic Church, in its Magisterium, has final authority to interpret the truth we find in the Scriptures. (CCC#85, 100)
3. The scriptures contain stories of how God reveals Himself through the lives of men and women (REVELATION) (CCC #61, 64, 76, 142, 144)
4. Students should be familiar with the structure of the bible. Be able to locate the Old and New Testaments, Torah, Prophets, Psalms, Gospels, Letters, etc.
5. The Old Testament tells the story of the relationship between God and the people of Israel. (CCC#62-64)
6. The stories of Creation and the Fall help us to understand who we are and what God wants for us. (CCC#282, 356-359, 396-398,402).
7. Through the unfolding of the Old Testament, we come to know Jesus as one pre-figured and foretold. (CCC# 518, 531)
8. The New Testament continues to unfold salvation history through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. (CCC# 124, 140)
9. The mission of Jesus is kept alive in the Catholic Church by the presence of the Holy Spirit. (CCC#737-738)
10. Students should participate in various forms of devotion and prayer (spontaneous prayer, blessings, adoration, prayer services, litanies, Stations of the Cross, novenas, chaplets, petitions, intercession, thanksgiving, praise). *This objective should be reinforced many times throughout the year.*
