“Lord, teach us to pray...”

This whole Gospel passage comes from a simple request: “Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples how to pray.” What a great prayer. It’s from this request we receive the Lord’s Prayer, the Our Father and we get these other sayings from Jesus, both dealing with a persistence in our prayer. If we really think about it, the gift of the Lord’s Prayer is huge. Jesus gives us the opportunity to call God, our Father. For us this signifies this brotherhood we have with Christ, which allows us a share in an eternal inheritance and the opportunity to call God, our Father. We are beloved children of God. This isn’t something that is humiliating or degrading. This is our most-awesome dignity and it should give us confidence in our prayer life. It’s worth noting that one of the first petitions in the Lord’s Prayer is, “Thy will be done.” We ask that God’s will be done and then we ask that our smaller concerns be brought into God’s love for us and His love for the world. All from a simple request, “Lord, teach us to pray...” Perhaps today, we can make that request and find behind it a rich and robust life centered in Christ with true communion with God and His Church, growing deeper in both personal and communal prayer.

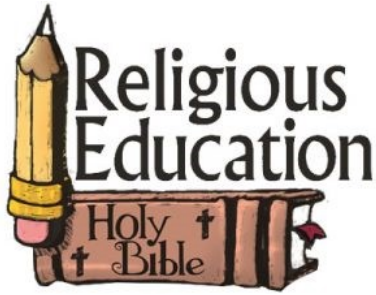

First Saturday Requirements

The elements of this devotion consist in the following four points, all of which must be offered in reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. One should make the intention of reparation for blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart for at least five consecutive months.

- Confession (shortly before or after the First Saturday—so long as the person receives Holy Communion in a state of grace)
- Holy communion received on the First Saturday of each month
- Recite the Holy Rosary, five decades recited some time during the day
- Meditating for 15 minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary (one or more)

Mental Health First Aid Workshops

The Diocese of Jackson’s Office of Family Ministry and Catholic Charities Office of Parish Health Ministry, Mississippi State Department of Health, and Belhaven University are co-sponsoring a two day workshop on first-aid for mental health. “Mental Health First Aid” (MHFA) teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders in your community. It is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, law enforcement, and other caring citizens how to offer initial help to someone who is experiencing a mental health or addiction challenge or is in crisis.

All are welcome! Two separate trainings will be offered at St. James Catholic Church in Tupelo, MS on August 22nd (Adult Training) and August 23rd (Youth Training) from 8:00AM – 5:00PM. Registration includes lunch. The workshops will be led by Dr. Bradford Smith, Ph.D., Licensed Phycologist and Certified Instructor. Registration is required. Registration includes: Lunch, a comprehensive manual and a three year MHFA certification. Attending the full program is required to obtain certification. Fee: \$10 per class.
