### “I will give you shepherds”

Throughout the course of human history and even throughout our own lives, we see times, events, seasons, and personal issues that can be a source of temptation to lead us to despair. We have and we will see war, epidemic, illness, violence, natural disaster, and the like. But with the passage of time and the grace of God, these things shall pass and new hopes emerge. In the Book of Jeremiah, he prophesies that there will be a great exile and that exile does indeed come. Then God, through Jeremiah, uses the image of a shepherd to show that He will one day rule His people as a shepherd. “I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them, so that they need no longer fear and tremble” (Jer. 23: 4). God’s promise intends to reflect the regathering and leading of the flock back to the promised land. But God is also foreshadowing the coming of the Messiah who will come to shepherd His people. Jesus in the Gospel tells His disciples, “Come...and rest a while.” Jesus is the Good Shepherd who ultimately regathers His people and offers them rest. He offers us rest only He can give. Let us take solace in the fact that God has given us a Messiah who offers us hope in the face of desolation. Hang on to hope and keep the faith!

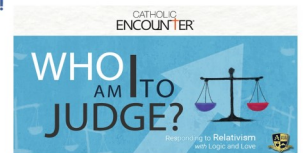
