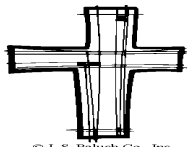

CHANGE OUR LIVES

In today's first reading, *Jonah*, sent by God to warn the people, storms through Nineveh, frightening the citizens out of their wits. It works! They repent before Jonah makes his way through a third of the city, and God sees "by their actions" how they have turned from evil.



Then we hear Paul telling the Corinthians that "the world in its present form is passing away." He calls for a change of heart. He stops short of telling them to set aside their everyday lives, but still he urges them—rather mysteriously—to live as though they aren't doing the things they're doing.

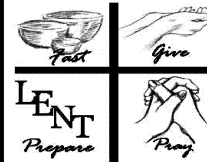

AN APPEAL . . .

Next weekend (January 31st / February 1st) a second collection will be taken for the missionary work done by Carmelite Fathers in parts of the underdeveloped world, especially in Peru, Brazil, Mexico, Indonesia, the Philippines and Zimbabwe, Africa. Envelopes will be available in the narthex for your contribution.

In Sicuani, Peru, in one of the most remote areas of the Southern Andes mountains, Carmelites care for an entire diocese. The Ordinary is Bishop Michael La Fay, O. Carm. His people live in the midst of extreme poverty. Ninety percent (90%) suffer from malnutrition, 80% have TB and one out of three children die before his/her first birthday. The life expectancy of everyone is only 35 years!

Carmelites in Sicuani and in those other places must feed the hungry, attend the sick, provide schools and other service to those pain-filled people, as they proclaim the Good News of God's loving kindness. Jesus promised an eternal reward to those who would give even a cup of cold water to the poor in His name. Your generosity in the collection for Carmelite Missions next weekend will allow Bishop LaFay and so many other Carmelites to give their people much more than a cup of cold water. The Lord will indeed reward you - as only He can!

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is when a parish sets a small room, or chapel, that is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with permanent exposition of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, the Holy Eucharist. It is simply our response to Jesus' love for us, whereby each person is willing to spend a quiet holy hour of prayer in His Eucharistic Presence once a week, so that Jesus is never left alone, and the chapel is always open for anyone to visit Him.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

*As a result of the reform-
sof the Second Vatican
Council, the Church has
defined a new pastoral plan for your care whenever
you struggle with illness. There are rites for chil-
dren, a communal rite for celebration in the parish,
forms of care for the sick at each stage and transi-
tion, and for the desperately ill. There is a much
broader interpretation of who may be anointed, in-
cluding not only the visibly ill, but those battling
addiction, or the elderly coping with the frustrating
aches and pains of aging. Children under seven are
normally not anointed, since the oil is associated
with reconciliation. (For the same reason, they do
not receive ashes on Ash Wednesday.) However,
children close to that age who have a serious illness
often gain a deep level of spiritual insight and ma-
turity, and may benefit from catechesis for the
Eucharist. Once admitted to confirmation and/or
Eucharist, a sick child should be anointed. It is a
great strength of our present rite that a section is
included with prayers tailored to the experience and
understanding of a child. Considering our recent
history of being fairly sparing with this sacrament,
the generosity of celebration today is helping us to
retrieve an essential part of our tradition of rever-
ence for the sick.*
