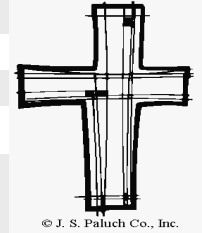

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Year B of the Lectionary has the Letter to the Ephesians today. Ephesus, today in Turkey, was in the first century a great Greek city, the center for the worship of Diana, the goddess of the hunt. It was a vast city even by modern standards, having nearly half a million people in the time of Paul. Yet that was a time of economic recession and moral decay. No wonder Saint Paul stayed here the longest. It gave him an enormous and religiously curious audience. His preaching stirred up the artisans who depended on the pilgrims who came to honor (and buy mementos of) seventeen gods and goddesses enshrined in the city's temples. You can still see the open-air theater where Paul's homily triggered a riot. Paul did have success here, and many conversions among Jews and Gentiles. They seem to have struggled with hope, perhaps because of their suffering from economic woes and isolation. Some old traditions say that the Apostle John lived out his days here, and that the Blessed Mother was cared for by him. There's no biblical basis for this, but it is certain that a small house just outside the city has been treasured by Christians and Muslims for centuries as the last dwelling of Mary. Long ago, the harbor silted up and the city was nearly abandoned, becoming a small village. As is so often the case, that accident of history preserved the ancient city, so that archeologists have been very successful in revealing ancient Christian sites. One such site is the Church of Mary, probably the first church to be dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, and the site of the Council of Ephesus in 431. Today, a visit to Ephesus is one of the most rewarding journeys for any pilgrim.

SECOND COLLECTION

March 10th-11th, 2018

This week, we are taking up the **Catholic Relief Services** Collection to respond to Jesus in disguise. This collection helps six Catholic agencies to provide relief and support to struggling communities and to work toward peace and reconciliation among our marginalized brothers and sisters here and around the world. Please prayerfully consider how you can support the collection.

Prayer Starters for All the Days of Lent by Tom McGrath

... God's promise, "I will be with you always." Whether you begin this journey on Ash Wednesday or another day, for the next 40 days you have the chance to give some time over to spiritual growth. Here we continue the outline that can help you focus on a different virtue or spiritual practice each day.

Pray today for: (Prayers # 1—24 printed in previous Bulletins).

- 25. **Patience.** God works through nature, and nature takes its time. Pray for patience today, to adjust to the rhythms of nature on your spiritual journey. Think of the seed underground, ready to sprout on the appointed day.
- 26. **Zeal.** Ask God to fill your heart with enthusiasm for following God's ways. Do something today that calls you out of any ruts you find yourself in. Realize that God wants us to experience joy in our faithfulness.
- 27. **A good clean-up.** Sometimes disorder in our home or office reflects a spiritual block within. As you tidy up a mess that saps your spiritual energy, pray that God will help clear away the blocks within you.
- 28. **Compassion.** Gospel stories often relate how Jesus was moved by compassion. Pray for an increase in your own capacity to feel the pain and sorrow of others so you might be a channel of peace to them.
- 29. **Constancy.** Jesus said, "I am with you always." Pray that you might be able to follow his example and be truly present with love to those around you—your family, your friends, your co-workers, your neighbors.
- 30. **Willingness.** Sometimes we fear that we are incapable or unworthy of spiritual growth and transformation. And it's true that we cannot redeem ourselves. But all it takes is the least bit of willingness of God to enter our hearts and begin the transformation. Today, pray for willingness the size of a mustard seed.
- 31. **Release of anger.** Anger can be a holy emotion that fuels us to protect the innocent and work for justice. But ongoing anger can easily get twisted into vengeance and hate. Pray today that God will help you let go of anger that no longer serves its holy purpose.
- 32. **Courage.** Life often brings challenges and difficulties, trouble and woe. Like Jesus in the garden, pray today for the courage to continue to show up fully for life and not run and hide.
