THE IMPORTANCE OF REGISTERING AT A PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong to that parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a particular church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows that you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining certificates and getting contribution statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
