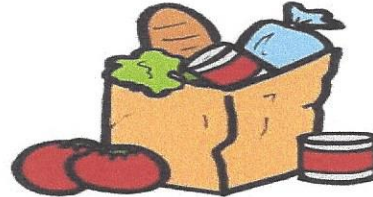
This month, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul enabled the poor to experience Jesus' presence by assisting families, providing food, money for utility and rent bills.

POPE GREGORY 1 – BISHOP OF ROME

FEAST DAY – SEPTEMBER 3

Pope Gregory, commonly known as Saint Gregory the Great, was the bishop of Rome from 3 September 590 to his death.

He is known for instigating the first recorded large-scale mission from Rome, the Gregorian Mission, to convert the then-pagan Anglo-Saxons in England to Christianity. Gregory is also well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as Pope. Gregory is a Doctor of the Church and one of the Latin Fathers. He is considered a saint not only in the Catholic Church, but many protestant denominations. He is the patron saint of musicians, singers, students, and teachers.
