### FEAST DAY OF POPE JOHN PAUL II – OCTOBER 22

Pope John Paul II was born Karol Jozef Wojtyla on May 18, 1920 in the city of Wadowice in Poland. His papacy began the 16<sup>th</sup> of October, 1978 and ended on the date of his death, April 2, 2005.

John Paul II was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. He travelled abroad extensively in an effort to promote greater understanding between countries and religions, and campaigned against political oppression, violence, and materialism.

John Paul II significantly improved the Catholic Church's relations with Judaism, Islam, and the Eastern Orthodox Church. He upheld the Church's teachings on such matters as the right to life, artificial contraception, the ordination of women, and a celibate clergy, and although he supported the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, he was seen as generally conservative in their interpretation.

On December 19, 2009, John Paul II was proclaimed venerable by his successor, Benedict XVI, and was beatified on May 1, 2011, Divine Mercy Sunday. He was canonized on April 27, 2014, again on Divine Mercy Sunday.
