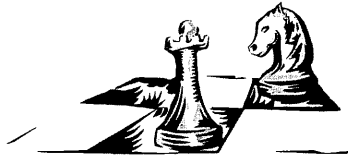

Why Study Chess?

Develop critical thinking skills and learn to graciously win and lose. Have great fun while stimulating your problem-solving spirit. Chess is highlighted in "How Children Succeed" a British book reviewed in "The Economist" magazine. It argues that chess develops character traits such as grit, determination, and perseverance which are as important as test scores. Focus and concentration are critical learning skills!

Chess in the World...

...is a game of the ages with tremendous lore. Over ten thousand books on it in English. Many Grandmasters hail from Eastern Europe where they are great celebrities.

Chess in the U.S...

Numerous families have discovered the great fun and mind developing benefits of this strategic game. Scholastic chess in the U.S. grew 700% during the 1990's. Super National competitions have set world records every four years since 1997, recently drawing over 6,000 students!

Chess Opportunities in Pittsburgh

Nationally rated tournaments for young students are held at least monthly at Universities and High Schools in the city. Ask the instructor for info. For serious players of all ages, The Pittsburgh Chess League plays one slow game per month during the school year. Enroll in September for games held Sunday afternoons at the Pitt Student Union.

Spring Class Information

A ten-week session of Tuesdays for students in grades 1-8 runs March 10th thru May 12th from 2:50 to 3:50 PM. The classes will be downstairs in the Art Classroom. Dismissal will be thru the Gym doors. Classes include 30 minutes of instruction followed by 30 minutes of play paired by experience and results. John Surlow has taught chess in local schools for over 20 years; he previously coached St. Paul's Catholic school in Los Angeles to numerous state chess championships. He is a USCF certified Senior Tournament Director, and ran hundreds of scholastic competitions. He was a 15 year Board Member of the Pittsburgh Chess Club and captains a winning team in the Pittsburgh Chess League. The 12 person team has included one Holy Trinity alumnus and a current AGS student who have taken multiples years of chess classes at the school. Mr. Surlow is a former High School Math and Middle School Science teacher who spent two decades as a manager of programmers and systems analysts in Insurance and Aerospace. Both his sons both became the nation's top-rated ten year-olds in Chess.
