Baptism Godparents

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Godparent for Baptism. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Penance/Reconciliation

We invite you to participate in the Penance & Reconciliation at the times specified in the front of this bulletin.

Holy Eucharist

We invite you to participate in the Holy Eucharist daily at the times specified on the front of this bulletin. If you have not had the opportunity to make your Holy Communion, please contact the Parish Office.

Confirmation Sponsors

Must be 16 years old, registered as an adult and be confirmed in the Catholic Church. If you are married, your marriage must be recognized by the church. This is especially important if you wish to be a Sponsor for Confirmation. It takes six months of attending Mass to be eligible for this privilege.

Marriage

The common policy of marriage requires that arrangements with the church be made at least one year before the date of marriage and before any social plans are made. Either the Bride or Groom must be a registered parishioner. If you would like to get more information about getting married, please contact the Parish Office.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

In our continuing catechesis on the “Our Father”, we now turn to the third invocation, “thy will be done”. We see God’s will revealed in the person of Jesus: to seek out and to save that which is lost. If we do not appreciate this we risk misunderstanding the meaning of the third aspect of the “Our Father”. We can affirm, however, without a doubt, that God’s will is indeed for the salvation of all mankind. Our prayer, then, is offered by children who know their Father’s heart and are certain of his loving plan. This prayer, moreover, inspires in us the same desire for the Father’s will as we see in Jesus, especially when, in the garden of Gethsemane, he prayed, “Father, if you are willing, remove this chalice from me; nevertheless not my will, but yours, be done” (Lk 22:42). Jesus is crushed by the world’s wickedness, yet he abandons himself faithfully to the Father’s will. We can do likewise, for the conviction that God will never abandon us is more than a hope. It is a certainty!

From the desk of...

Bishop James F. Checchio
March 21, 2019



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

When we are baptized, the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in our soul with powerful gifts: faith, hope and love. They are precious gifts that we cannot earn. They can only be renewed by God and so often by way of His Church. I have to tell you that I have been renewed in my Christian faith and friendship with Christ, as I am truly overwhelmed by your kindness in these past months. The unexpected death of my father last month was a great loss for my family. The number of cards, assurance of prayers and Masses being offered for him and my family were uplifting. I am so grateful to you for your many kindnesses. They certainly are helping to sustain me and my family during these sad days of transitioning to life without my dad here with us. During the past several months, we have all experienced a deep sadness because of the horrors of past abuse by priests and even our former bishop, which have barraged us almost daily in news reports. It has been a time of testing and pain, and indeed, at times exasperating. It is certainly horrifying and discouraging to me as a new bishop and as the bishop here now. These reports have motivated me to work and pray to be an instrument of healing of all those who have been abused, as well as to work so it may never happen again. I also pray that this is a time of purification for our beloved Church. I am particularly grateful for the many people who have written with suggestions for a better road forward and have also expressed their understanding and support for me and my ministry during these trying days. Your prayers and words are much appreciated.

What I hear most frequently is the desire to stay the course and to never become complacent. Since 2002, we have been reporting all claims to prosecutors, mandating training and background checks, and not allowing anyone with a credible accusation to serve in the priesthood. Each of these measures help in a process of reform. Gratefully, we recently were once again found in compliance with the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People for the 2017/2018 audit period. An article on our diocese’s efforts to be in compliance with the Charter was published in the Feb. 7 issue of “The Catholic Spirit.”

I have sought to share information regarding the status of any clergy or Church personnel credibly accused and to be as transparent as possible and will continue to do so. I pledge anew to work for healing and to work with all the energy I have and the grace God gives me to ensure that we never return to these dark times.

**Year A Readings will be used on the 3rd, 4th
and 5th Sundays of Lent**

On these last three Sundays before Palm Sunday we will hear and reflect on the ancient scripture lessons of the early church, used for the final preparation of those who were to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. These Year A gospel lessons are from John's gospel and are rich in symbolism and layers of meaning regarding the sacrament of baptism: Jesus meeting the Samaritan Woman at the Well, Healing the Man Born Blind, and the Raising of Lazarus from the Dead. Bishop James Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass on April 15 at 4:00pm at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi, Metuchen. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless the Holy Oils which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used before Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and the Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the newly baptized, confirmandi, priests at their ordination and altar and walls of new churches. At this Mass, all priests will make a Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service, recommitting themselves to the Bishop, their ministry to God and His People.
