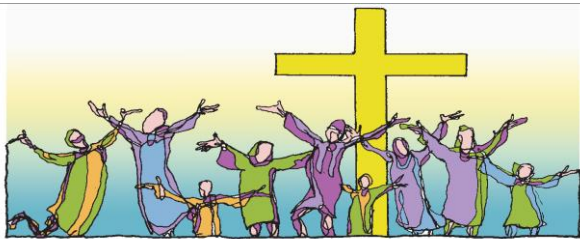
**Protection from Storms**
