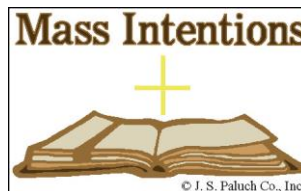
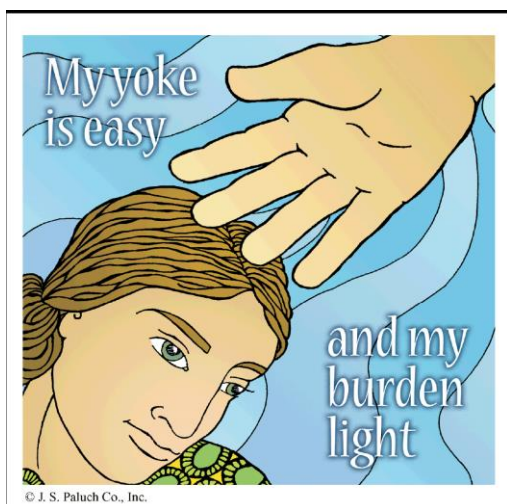
TODAY’S READINGS
