Sundays – **Mass – 8 am** – St. Ann

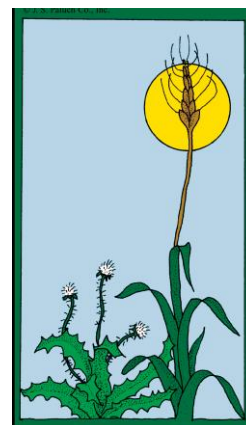
CONFESSIONS – 30 minutes before each Mass

**THE MERCY, POWER, AND LOVE OF GOD**

The first reading today, from the book of Wisdom, makes its point over and over, at least five times in five verses! God is mighty, but lenient to all. 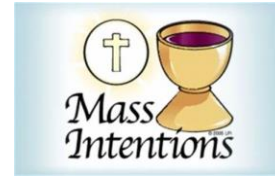

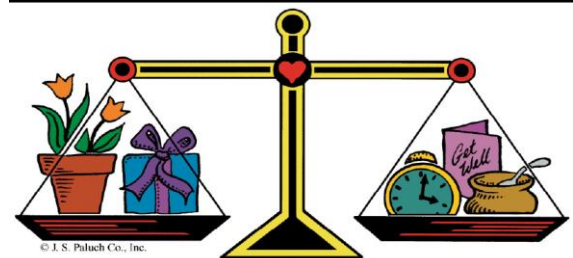
